Dear Dr. Polonsky

The Office of Laboratory Animal Welfare (OLAW) acknowledges receipt of your March 12, 2019 letter reporting an instance of noncompliance with the PHS Policy on Humane Care and Use of Laboratory Animals at the University of Chicago. According to the information provided, OLAW understands that a nonhuman primate on an approved fluid restriction study failed to receive the approved amount of fluid over a weekend, following up on an initial telephone report on March 19, 2019. Miscommunication between laboratory staff led to no additional water being given for two days, although a full water bottle had been provided on Friday.

The immediate action taken upon discovery consisted of providing water and having the veterinarian examine the monkey. The animal was found to be doing well and was given unlimited water for two weeks and continued to be healthy. The Principal Investigator and staff were counseled and a plan was put in place to ensure that the animals receive the approved fluid amount daily.

Based on its assessment of this explanation, OLAW understands that measures have been implemented to correct and prevent recurrence of this problem. OLAW concurs with the actions taken by the institution to comply with the PHS Policy.

I write to provide the final report of an incident the University of Chicago IACUC determined represented a serious deviation from the provisions of the *Guide for the Care and Use of Laboratory Animals*. A preliminary report was provided by phone on February 27<sup>th</sup> from (b) (6)

On January 14<sup>th</sup> an investigator self-reported that a nonhuman primate had not received the protocol approved amount of fluid over a weekend. The protocol is approved for fluid regulation and laboratory staff are responsible for providing the proper amount of fluids to the animal. The animal underwent training each day of the prior week (Mon-Fri) after which treats and fluid were provided. The animal was provided a full water bottle on Friday afternoon but due to a miscommunication between laboratory staff, the water bottle was not replenished on Saturday or Sunday. On Monday afternoon, upon realizing the animal had not received replenishment of the water bottle, a staff member initially provided a small amount of water before placing a full bottle of water on the cage and paging the on-call veterinarian. A clinical evaluation by the veterinarian found the animal to be bright, alert, responsive and eating. The animal remained on ad libitum fluid for the following two weeks and did not present with any clinical symptoms of poor physical or psychological health.

ARC health checks on Saturday and Sunday found the animal to be bright, alert, responsive, eating the daily ration of biscuits and consuming all treats offered. Urine and fecal material was present in the waste pan. Interviews with veterinary technicians and laboratory staff revealed the animal typically consumes approximately half a water bottle each day. Based upon this observation, the IACUC surmised the full bottle provided on Friday may have lasted for the two day period.

Veterinary staff met with the principal investigator and staff responsible to discuss the seriousness of the issue, determine how the incident occurred and evaluate methods together to prevent this from reoccurring. The principal investigator discussed the incident with all staff at a lab meeting and developed a plan to ensure animals receive the protocol approved amount or ad libitum fluid daily. The IACUC reviewed this plan and was satisfied with the response and considers this matter resolved. The

protocol under which this animal was assigned is supported by internal funding and NIH Grant #R01EY019041.

The incident was self reported as a critical noncompliance to the USDA Veterinary Medical Officer (VMO) for the University of Chicago by the Attending Veterinarian.
