Submission of semiannual reports to the Institutional Official is a condition of this Institution's Animal Welfare Assurance with the NIH Office of Laboratory Animal Welfare (OLAW).

I. Description of the Nature and Extent of the Institution's Adherence to the PHS Policy, the *Guide*, and the AWA:

The USDA APHIS National Wildlife Research Center (NWRC) in Fort Collins, CO was granted an OLAW Animal Welfare Assurance (#A4676-01) on August 14, 2012.

Based upon the semiannual facility inspection and semiannual program evaluation conducted for the period of October 1, 2015 through March 31, 2016, The NWRC Animal Facilities and Animal Care and Use Program appear to be in compliance with the PHS Policy, the Guide for the Care and Use of Laboratory Animals, and the Animal Welfare Regulations.

II. Deficiencies in the Institution's Animal Care and Use Program
