Dear Ms. Lewis,

The Office of Laboratory Animal Welfare (OLAW) acknowledges receipt of your letter dated June 17, 2019 regarding a reportable incident at your institution. This is a final report that was not preceded by a preliminary report to this office.

According to the information provided, our office understands that one mouse on a PHS funded activity escaped during approved study procedures in April 9, 2019. Despite efforts to recapture the mouse, it eluded recapture and its carcass was found by a postdoctoral student approximately two to three days later. It is surmised that the mouse, due to its small size, was able to slip out of a testing cubicle and into the attached food hopper, from which it was able to jump to the floor and escape.

The corrective measures involved lab member training focusing on handling of the strain of mouse in question, since it is unusually small relative to other strains. Training on prompt communication was also initiated, so that LAR staff could assist with recovery efforts. The IACUC Chair and LAR director are also evaluating communication and reporting SOPs in light of this incident.

Based on its assessment of this explanation, OLAW understands that measures have been taken to prevent recurrence of this problem. OLAW concurs with the actions taken by your institution to comply with the PHS Policy on Humane Care and Use of Laboratory Animals. We appreciate having been informed of this matter and find no cause for further action by this office.

Binghamton University, in accordance with **PHS Assurance # D16-00063** and PHS Policy IV.F3, is reporting an incident of noncompliance associated with NIH funding (P50 DA039841-subaward). This incident involved a mouse whose health and well-being was jeopardized.

On April 9, 2019, one (1) CAST/EiJ mouse escaped from a Lab Technician while performing approved study procedures (Protocol 802-18). Although every effort was made to re-capture the mouse, it was not immediately found. The Binghamton University Laboratory Animal Resources (LAR) staff was notified of the incident approximately 3.5 hours after the mouse escaped. The room was secured and food was provided as the search continued. Approximately 2-3 days after the mouse's disappearance, a carcass was found in the room by the postdoctoral researcher assigned to this lab and it was determined to be that of the missing mouse.

This particular strain of mice is very small and can be difficult to handle. Although the PI had modified the lab's testing apparatus in ways that reduced the possibility of escape, this mouse was particularly small and slipped out of his testing cubicle into an attached food hopper. It is from this hopper that he jumped to the floor and escaped.

In an effort to prevent a recurrence, lab members will be retrained on special handling for this strain and prompt reporting. In order for communications to be more effective, the Principal Investigator and the lab members will be directed to immediately notify the LAR staff when an animal is lost to support the recovery effort. The Principal Investigator will be instructed to notify the IACUC Chair as soon as possible of such an occurrence. In addition, the IACUC Chair and LAR Director will review current SOPs related to communications and reporting to ensure necessary and effective processes are delineated and distributed to all Principal Investigators.
