Dear Dr. Khargonekar,

The Office of Laboratory Animal Welfare (OLAW) acknowledges receipt of your December 18, 2019 letter reporting an instance of noncompliance with the PHS Policy on Humane Care and Use of Laboratory Animals at the University of California, Irvine. According to the information provided, OLAW understands that as part of a routine annual review of an approved protocol, it was reported that a rat died after being left in a recovery cage in a procedure room instead of being returned to the home cage in the vivarium. It was stated that this animal activity was PHS-funded.

It is understood that the corrective action plan included discussing the incident with all lab members during lab meetings and instructing all staff researchers and students to always check the procedure room at the end of the day. The PI has instituted procedures for documenting the training of all members of the research team. In addition, the lab will implement a recording system to list each lab member's responsibilities and indicate when the individual has completed each task. All members of the research team must complete remedial training.

OLAW appreciates the prompt consideration of this matter by the University of California, Irvine, which was consistent with the philosophy of institutional self-regulation. Based on the information provided, OLAW is satisfied that appropriate actions have been taken to investigate and correct the deficiency, and to prevent recurrence. We do emphasize that all PIs should be advised to not wait until a protocols Annual Review to report an animal welfare incident. This should be done promptly so that the IACUC can fulfill its responsibilities in a timely manner. We appreciate being informed of this matter and find no cause for further action by this office.

Dear Dr. Morse:

The University of California, Irvine (UCI) is reporting an animal welfare issue involving a rat on a federally-funded study. The incident was reported as part of a routine Annual Review of the approved protocol (AUP-18-145). Funding for the project is provided by NIH grant number R44 EY027654.

In the Annual Review, the Principal Investigator reported that a single rat was accidentally left in a recovery cage in a procedure room; other rats in the same cohort were returned to their home cages and vivarium housing room. The animal left in the procedure room was later found dead.

The UCI IACUC discussed the Annual Report and determined that the incident necessitated reporting to OLAW as a condition that led to the death of an animal. Please note that this was an isolated incident, an unfortunate accident in an otherwise compliant laboratory.

The Principal Investigator and her staff took the following actions in response to this situation:

- The incident was discussed in depth with all members of the laboratory staff during routine lab meetings. The seriousness of the event was emphasized to all members of the research team.
- All staff researchers and students were instructed to always check the procedure room at the end of the day and to notify others in the laboratory if they could not complete this task.
- The Principal Investigator has instituted procedures for documenting the training of all members of the research staff. IACUC members routinely review such records during semi-annual laboratory inspections.

The IACUC discussed the PI's actions at a subsequent convened meeting of the IACUC and determined the following additional actions were necessary to correct and prevent recurrence of this event:

- The lab will implement a recording system, either paper-based or computerized, to list each lab
 member's responsibilities and indicate when the responsible individuals have completed each
 task.
- All members of the research team must complete remedial training.
