The Office of Laboratory Animal Welfare (OLAW) acknowledges receipt of your January 8, 2020 letter reporting an unexpected event associated with the animal care and use program at the University of Alabama at Birmingham (UAB). Your letter supplements the information provided in the prompt preliminary telephone report on July 29, 2019. According to the information provided, OLAW understands that on July 17, 2019 two pigs died due to hyperthermia while being transported from UAB to another institution. The pigs were transported using a USDA-permitted intermediate handler/transporter. It is further understood that the USDA has been informed of this incident.

OLAW appreciates the transparency of this matter by the University of Alabama at Birmingham. Based on the information provided, OLAW understands that the welfare and care of the animals was the responsibility of the intermediate handler/transporter. We assume that prudent precautions will be put in place by UAB if this handler/transporter is considered again for shipping pigs. We appreciate being informed of this matter and find no cause for further action by this office.

Dear Dr. Morse:

This is a follow up to the preliminary report made to OLAW in July of 2019. The preliminary report follows OLAW guidance and provides complete transparency related to this unexpected event during transport of animals from the University of Alabama at Birmingham (UAB) to Emory University on July 17, 2019. The investigation concluded that UAB followed protocol for animal transport by using a USDA permitted intermediate handler/transporter who became the sole responsible party related to animal welfare once they took receipt. Hyperthermia during transport was determined as the cause of death. The UAB IACUC was informed about this transport event, but since it was determined to be the Intermediate Handler who bore the responsibility for the animal welfare, no recommendations or corrective actions are required. The matter was reported, at the time, to the USDA but we have no additional information related to their review.
