Dear Dr. Neubauer,

The Office of Laboratory Animal Welfare (OLAW) acknowledges receipt of your January 9, 2017 letter reporting an instance of noncompliance with the PHS Policy on Humane Care and Use of Laboratory Animals at Rutgers University. Your letter supplements the information in the initial phone report by no November 1, 2016. According to the information provided, OLAW understands that on October 26, 2016 an irradiator failed locking eight mice inside. A technician from the manufacturer was required to open the unit but was not available until November 21st, therefore the animals were euthanized. The irradiator was repaired and is operating normally. This activity was not funded by the PHS.

The prompt consideration of this unfortunate matter by Rutgers University was consistent with the philosophy of institutional self-regulation. Similarly, the actions taken to resolve the issue and prevent recurrence were appropriate. Although this activity was not PHS funded, the application of the standards of the PHS Policy across the animal care and use program reduces any potential appearance of a double standard. We appreciate being informed of this matter and find no cause for further action by this office.

Dear Dr. Wolff:

The information in this final report is presented as a follow-up to a phone conversation with Dr. Morse on November 1, 2016. Specifically, on October 26, 2016, a self-shielded irradiator failed. Although relevant University staff attempted to address the issue, ultimately a technician from the manufacturer was required. The technician was available on November 21st. Eight research animals were euthanized to minimize pain and distress. The technician determined that the door failed to open due to a broken lock-down solenoid spring in the tower portion of the irradiator. The irradiator is now fixed and is operating normally. The research animals were not from PHS-funded research activities.

Rutgers University is committed to protecting the welfare of animals used in research and appreciates the guidance and assistance provided by OLAW in this regard.
