Dear Dr. Moerschbaecher,

The Office of Laboratory Animal Welfare (OLAW) acknowledges receipt of your January 13, 2020 letter reporting a serious deviation from the provisions of the Guide for the Care and Use of Laboratory Animals at Louisiana State University Health Sciences Center. According to the information provided, OLAW understands that three rats died after the animal room overheated following maintenance of the heating, ventilation, and air conditioning system. A heating valve had been left open which caused the temperature in the animal room to rise above the acceptable level.

The immediate action taken upon discovery consisted of moving animals and attempting to revive one rat. The HVAC system was adjusted, the temperatures were monitored, and no further problems occurred.

Based on its assessment of this explanation, OLAW understands that measure have been implemented to correct this problem. OLAW concurs with the actions taken by the institution to comply with the PHS Policy on Humane Care and Use of Laboratory Animals.

Dear Dr. Morse,

On December 26th, 2019, there was a planned cooling water outage at two of the animal housing facilities on the LSUHSC campus. The high temperature forecast for that day was only 70F, so facilities did not anticipate needing air conditioning, because they planned to close the heating valves and supply fresh air. Unfortunately, a heating valve was opened in one of the housing facilities and allowed hot air to enter the rooms. A graduate student discovered the problem, and an investigator contacted the (b) (6) She was on campus within 30 minutes of the call and helped to move animals and institute veterinary care as needed. CPR was attempted on one of the rats that died to no avail. Three rats died in total. Thankfully, (b) (6) quickly provided assistance by correcting the problem and preventing further animal losses. The watch engineer monitored the temperatures overnight and the rooms remained within acceptable limits.
