Dear Dr. Turner,

The Office of Laboratory Animal Welfare (OLAW) acknowledges receipt of your November 21, 2019 letter reporting an instance of noncompliance with the PHS Policy on Humane Care and Use of Laboratory Animals at Oregon State University, following up on an initial telephone report on November 20, 2019. According to the information provided, OLAW understands that MS-222 was used to immobilize larval zebrafish although use of this agent had not been described in the approved protocol. The study was supported by NSF grants 1762245 and 1935028.

The corrective actions consisted of stopping use of the agent until a protocol amendment has been approved, amending the protocol to add the agent, and counseling the laboratory staff.

Based on its assessment of this explanation, OLAW understands that measures have been taken to correct and prevent recurrence of the problem. OLAW concurs with the actions taken by the institution to comply with the PHS Policy.

Dear Dr. Wolff:

In accordance with our Animal Welfare Assurance D16-00145 (A3229-01), we provide this report of noncompliance regarding use of MS-222 immobilization in zebrafish larvae for activities described in the NSF awards 1762245 and 1935028. This incident was first reported to Dr. Axel Wolff, OLAW, on November 20, 2019 via a telephone call by the IACUC administrator.

On September 10, 2019, an IACUC inspection team learned of a potential protocol non-compliance during inspection of an investigator's laboratory. A member of the laboratory described use of MS-222 to immobilize larval zebrafish (120 hours post-fertilization) for imaging; however, such use of MS-222 was not indicated in the approved protocol. On September 27, 2019, the PI submitted an incident report acknowledging the discrepancy with MS-222 use and also included an amendment to add use of MS-222 for immobilization purposes. In the report, the PI indicated halting use of MS-222 until protocol amendment approval and that the protocol will be reviewed with laboratory staff.

The amendment to add use of MS-222 for immobilization was approved on October 28, 2019. At the November 13, 2019 IACUC meeting, the committee reviewed the incident and actions taken by the PI to address this issue. Following review, the IACUC voted to close the incident report.


