Dear Dr. Hendricks,

The Office of Laboratory Animal Welfare (OLAW) acknowledges receipt of your October 24, 2019 letter reporting an instance of noncompliance with the PHS Policy on Humane Care and Use of Laboratory Animals at Seattle Children's Research Institute, following up on an initial report on September 5, 2019. According to the information provided, OLAW understands that 40 mice were subjected to a blood collection without approval from the Institutional Animal Care and Use Committee (IACUC). No adverse effects were noted in the mice.

The corrective actions consisted of amending the protocol, revising the technical services request form to ensure that all procedures have IACUC approval, retraining the laboratory staff, and ensuring that laboratory staff understand that only IACUC approved procedure may be performed. All institutional animal users have been informed about the requirement for following the protocol, the grant was not charged for any unauthorized animal activities, and the NIH funding component was notified.

Based on its assessment of this explanation, OLAW understands that measures have been implemented to prevent recurrence of this problem. OLAW concurs with the actions taken by the IACUC to comply with the PHS Policy.

Dear OLAW,

This letter is to provide you with a full explanation of the circumstances and actions taken following an incident at our institution as required by PHS Policy IV.F.3.a.

The Institutional Animal Care and Use Committee (IACUC) office received information that blood collection procedures were performed on 40 mice without appropriate IACUC review and approval. No lab members performed the blood collection; it was requested by the study team and performed by SCRI's Office of Animal Care (OAC) staff.

No animals were harmed as a result of the incident. The incident occurred due to a misunderstanding that the blood collection procedure had been added to the IACUC protocol at the most recent triennial review. Immediately following the incident, the PI submitted an amendment to the protocol and obtained IACUC review and approval for the procedure.

The incident was discussed by an IACUC subcommittee and at a convened meeting. The IACUC required the following additional corrective actions:

- OAC must revise their Technical Services Request (TSR) Form to inform study teams of their obligation to confirm the requested procedure is approved on the IACUC protocol before submitting:
- 2. OAC should consider revising the TSR Form to document which experiment in the IACUC protocol covers the requested procedure;
- 3. Lab members must re-take the online CITI module titled "Working with the IACUC"; and
- The PI must document (via a sign off sheet) that lab members understand that only IACUCapproved procedures are permissible and are trained on how to use SCRI's electronic protocol management system.

All corrective actions have since been completed. In addition, the IACUC office and OAC have participated in several Research Institute-wide communications emphasizing the importance of conducting research per protocol. The IACUC accepted these corrective actions as being sufficient to prevent recurrence.
