Dear Dr. Hetzer,

The Office of Laboratory Animal Welfare (OLAW) acknowledges receipt of your January 13, 2020 letter reporting an instance of noncompliance with the PHS Policy on Humane Care and Use of Laboratory Animals at the Salk Institute.

According to the information provided, this Office understands that the Salk Institute Animal Care and Use Committee (ACUC) determined that instances of noncompliance occurred with respect to: 5 cages of mice found with no feeder or food present on November 21, 2019. Investigation by the Research Compliance Analyst (RCA) revealed the mice were being fasted for 24h, bled for blood analysis, and then imaged in an MRI machine. It was determined that the 24h fasting and MRI procedures were not approved on the protocol. Food was provided to all cages and lab staff were instructed to cease research involving these procedures immediately. The IACUC convened a meeting and agreed to report the incident to OLAW and implement the following measures listed below.

- 1) The IACUC Chair and attending veterinarian met with the PI and researcher and requested submission of an amendment to add fasting and MRI for IACUC review.
- 2) The researcher's facility access was inactivated for one month. The researcher will be retrained on IACUC policies and expectations regarding reviewing and understanding the lab's approved protocol(s) before performing any procedures.
- 3) The lab manager was retrained on IACUC protocol review and approval processes and has committed to ensuring the lab members will be more proactive in reviewing their animal use protocols.
- 4) IACUC staff and RCA will provide retraining on IACUC policies and expectations to all personnel in the lab.

The lab has agreed to all corrective actions and are willing to acquire additional trainings to maintain compliance. Also, the RCA will continue to monitor the lab's research practices to evaluate efficacy of corrective actions implemented.

Based on its assessment of this explanation, OLAW understands that the Salk Institute has implemented appropriate measures to correct and prevent recurrences of these problems and is now compliant with provisions of the PHS Policy. The Salk Institute, in accordance with the reporting requirements as defined by PHS Policy IV.F.3 and Assurance A3539-01, hereby communicates the following incident pertaining to the NIH grant CA197687.

On 11/21/19, the IACUC office was notified of 5 cages of mice with no feeder or food by the animal resources department. Further investigation by the Research Compliance Analyst (RCA) revealed that mice were being fasted for 24 hours, bled for blood analysis, and then imaged in an MRI machine. Of these procedures, fasting for 24 hours and MRIs were not approved on the protocol. In consulting with the IACUC Chair and Attending Veterinarian (AV), food was provided to all cages and lab staff were instructed to stop research involving these procedures immediately.

The IACUC immediately convened a meeting in order to address this noncompliance and agreed to report this incident to OLAW as well as implement the following measures:

- The IACUC Chair and AV met with the PI and noncompliant researcher and requested immediate submission of an amendment to add fasting and MRI for IACUC review.
- The researcher's facility access has been inactivated for a month; the researcher will be retrained on IACUC policies and expectations regarding reviewing and understanding the lab's approved protocol/s before performing any procedures.
- 3. The lab manager has been re-trained on IACUC protocol review and approval processes and has committed to ensuring that lab members will be more proactive in reviewing their animal use protocols.
- 4. The IACUC Staff and RCA will provide a retraining on IACUC policies and expectations to all personnel in the lab.

The lab has acknowledged this oversight, agreed to all corrective actions items and are willing to acquire any additional trainings necessary to maintain compliance. Additionally, the RCA will continue to monitor the lab's research practices to evaluate efficacy of the corrective actions implemented.
