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### Attachment 1: Changes in the Institution's program for animal care and use as described in the Assurance

- 1. Change in IACUC Chair: Dr. Mark Westhusin replaced (b) (6) as IACUC Chair on February 1, 2019.
- Change in Applicability of Assurance Section I: This Animal Welfare Assurance also applies to activities involving live vertebrate animals supported by the NSF.
- 3. Change in Attending Veterinarian Section I.B: Dr. Robert Rose has replaced Dr. (b) (6) as the Attending Veterinarian for Texas A&M University. Dr. Rose, serves as Executive Director of the Comparative Medicine Program (CMP), is a voting member of the IACUC, devotes 100% effort fulfilling the responsibilities of the program, and has full program authority and responsibility for the Institutional animal care and use program. Dr. Rose received his DVM degree from Texas A&M University in 1985 and joined Texas A&M in late January 2019 with over 18 years of experience in laboratory animal medicine and is a Diplomat in the American College of Laboratory Animal Medicine. In addition to his experience in laboratory animal care, Dr. Rose practiced private clinical medicine for 16 years prior to his laboratory animal career which affords him extensive hands on experience in diagnosis and treatment of animals.

- 9. Change in Continuing Review Procedure Section III.D.9): Continuing Review documents submitted for protocols with USDA regulated species are reviewed as described for Protocols and Significant Modifications, rather than automatically undergoing FCR as described in the Assurance.

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- 10. Change in Suspension Procedures Section III.D.10): The Institutional Official will be notified of a suspension in an expedient manner; however, this may not occur within one working day of the IACUC vote to suspend the protocol.
- 11. Change to New IACUC Member Training Section III.G.: Live training of new IACUC members may be performed by individual(s) deemed to have the appropriate qualifications by the IACUC Chair; such as the IACUC Chair, Vice Chair, AV or designee, AWO Director or designee, individually or in combination.
- **12. Change in Submission of Facility Inspection Reports to the IO Section IV:** Facility inspection reports are submitted to the IO semiannually with the Semiannual Report to the IO, with the exception of significant findings, which are reported in an expedient manner after IACUC review of the finding and categorization as significant. IACUC review of inspection findings are reported in the monthly minutes.
