Summary of exemptions:

One protocol #48-8-0510 involves the use of metabolic caging for the collection of urine to compare the effects of novel diuretics in comparison with conventional drugs for the treatment of heart failure. For these measurements, animals must be confined for a defined period of time in the metabolic cage. Urine collection is done on five occasions per dog, once prior to pacing and once weekly for the next four weeks during pacing. Animals are confined to the metabolic cage overnight once a week. During the rest of the time, animals are free to exercise normally as per our guidelines for the dog exercise program.
