CAC Approved Exemptions to Animal Welfare Guidelines and Regulations

Primates in the upper weight range of Group 3 (as defined by the USDA regulations) will be housed in cages that provide supplemental volume if the floor area does not meet USDA engineering standards. Primates housed singly will be housed in cages that provide supplemental cage volume. Approximately twice the vertical space or twice the horizontal space, as required by the Animal Welfare Act regulations, will be provided. These cages will be considered "innovative housing" and will be exempt from floor area requirements in the Animal Welfare Act. During the period 10/1/07 through 9/30/08, four macaques were housed in innovative housing.

Water-restricted primates are exempted from one hour of *ad libitum* water twice/day. The exemption from *ad libitum* water for an hour twice daily is implicit in CAC approval of protocols using water restriction for primates. For the USDA reporting period 10/01/07 through 9/30/08, 67 macaques were impacted by water restriction.
