Exception to Standards

We request that our previously filed "exception to standards" be maintained for up to fifty-five (55) of our Non-Human Primates to receive water on a daily schedule that is less than the minimum requirement under the regulations in section 3.83. This section states "Potable water must be provided in sufficient quantity to every nonhuman primates, it must be offered to them as often as necessary to ensure their health and well-being, but no less than twice daily for at least 1 hour each time, unless otherwise required by the attending veterinarian or as required by the research proposal approved by the Committee at the research facilities."

As four of our HMS investigators are offering juice rewards to NHPs for behavioral studies with awake macaques at less than the above minimum for water, we have an exception to section 3.83 as described and institutionally approved by the Harvard Medical School IACUC. We ask that this exception to thirty-six (36) Non-Human Primates be so noted in our 2009 Annual Report and maintained through 2010. During the 2008 USDA reporting period, thirty-nine (39) macaques were actually water restricted.
