 One protocol was approved for controlled water access to be used as a positive reinforcement tool for nonhuman primates involved in a cognitive neuroscience behavioral study. The IACUC approval was based on scientific justification. Four bonnet macaques were used under this protocol during this reporting period.

The IACUC granted permission to house swine and sheep in the same room, however in separate pens in the Division of Laboratory Animal Resources Facility. The average daily census is 2 sheep and 2 swine.

3. The IACUC granted permission to allow bat housing cages to go for extended periods of time without washing/sanitizing to preserve the scent/marking stability of this species. The bats are used in a protocol involving reproduction study and the stress by cleaning and removing scent markings significantly alters gestation periods. The average daily census is 132 bats.
