As detailed in approved protocol #07047, the proposed water restriction schedule entails offering the animal its maintenance fluid requirements of 40-80 cc/kg per training session, though not necessarily offered at a frequency of twice daily for at least 1 hour. When the animal is not on study (Friday afternoon until Sunday morning), it has free access to its water bottle containing up to twice its daily average water consumption. This approved protocol involves 12 nonhuman primates (*Macaca mulatta*) and this exemption was approved by the IACUC on 7/18/2007 and reviewed during the semi-annual review of our animal care and use program at the latest IACUC meeting held on 1/12/2009.
