Water Restriction:

Forty-six Rhesus macaques were provided with water daily during the week in frequent, small amounts depending upon the individual animal, in studies in which they were motivated to perform behavioral tasks under protocols approved by Columbia and NYSPI IACUCs. These animals were well hydrated at all times. They were provided with usual amounts of water during the weekends and unlimited amounts of water when off study.

Three Baboon Cages:

Three Baboons, with approval of the IACUC, were housed in innovative primary enclosures not precisely meeting the floor area requirements, but with perches and significantly higher heights than provided in paragraphs (b)(1) and (b)(2) of 9CFR Chap. I, Part 3, Subpart D, Sec. 3.80, Primary enclosures, that provided them with sufficient volume of space and the opportunity to express species-typical behavior. All animals demonstrate normal behavior without stereotypes and have established a social order within their stable housing room through visual contact, postural movements and sound. They comfortably used vertical positions within their enclosures to communicate well-established social hierarchy within the room.
