III. D. 6) Amendments to protocols that do not involve a dog, cat or non-human primate may be processed administratively after veterinary verification and consultation (VVC) if they meet the following criteria per the UC San Diego IACUC Protocol Review Process (Policy 39):

- a. Addition of Buprenorphine SR as post-operative analgesia, with dosage and application schedule as recommended by the ACP veterinarian.
- b. In cases of drug supply shortages, at the recommendation of an ACP veterinarian, an extension of an existing drug's expiration date for a specified period of time or use of a non-pharmaceutical grade equivalent of the approved drug for a specified time.
- c. Addition or replacement of a euthanasia method that is acceptable (or conditionally acceptable when those conditions are met) according to the AVMA Guidelines for the Euthanasia of Animals.
- d. Replacement of an existing blood collection method or addition of a blood collection method when performed as described in the Blood Collection policy (Policy 5). The new method must not increase the potential risk and/or pain and distress level and at least one method must already be approved in the protocol.
- e. Addition or replacement of an approved experimental or therapeutic compound or agent for a similar compound or agent, or a change of dosage, frequency or application route for a compound or agent, only after ACP veterinary consultation, and if the expected drug action and possible adverse effects are comparable.
- f. Requests for permission to photograph or video animals according to IACUC Policy 29, Video and Photography in Animal Use Areas.

In these cases, a veterinarian authorized by the IACUC serves as a subject matter expert to verify that compliance with the IACUC-reviewed and approved policy is appropriate for the animals in this circumstance. Consultation with the veterinarian is documented. The veterinarian may refer any request to the IACUC for review for any reason and must refer any request that does not meet the parameters of the IACUC policies.

Additionally, in the letter to Dr. Sandra A. Brown, Vice Chancellor for Research, from the Office of Laboratory Animal Welfare (OLAW), dated July 25, 2019, Eileen Morgan requested the following updated information be provided to OLAW with UC San Diego's 2019 Annual Report.

1) Please provide an update on the minimum tank requirements for Environmental Enrichment for zebrafish.

A subcommittee of the UC San Diego Institutional Animal Care and Use Committee (IACUC) reviewed the relevant literature and consulted with a subject matter expert about zebrafish enrichment. After considerable deliberation, the IACUC voted unanimously to update the IACUC's Policy on Housing and Environmental Enrichment for Laboratory Animals to state, "Placing floating devices is encouraged in tanks of zebrafish with low density."

2) Please provide more detail regarding the additional information to be reviewed by the UCSD IACUC for the oversight of field studies.

Investigators with field studies are required to provide the following information for review by the IACUC on an annual basis:

- How many animals, by species, were used for the work described on (protocol) in the last year?
- If there has been no animal work, when do you expect to resume animal work?
- In general, what procedures were performed on these animals?
- What is the status of your permit(s) for this work?
- Are all personnel working with animals listed on your animal protocol?
- Have there been any adverse events, unexpected animal deaths or other problems related to animal use on this protocol?
- Were non-target animals affected by the research activity? If so, please describe.
