Dear Dr. Locascio,

The Office of Laboratory Animal Welfare (OLAW) acknowledges receipt of your May 28, 2019 letter reporting an instance of noncompliance with the PHS Policy on Humane Care and Use of Laboratory Animals at the University of Maryland – College Park. We received the initial report via a phone call on May 2, 2019. According to the information provided, OLAW understands that on December 16, 2018 a boiler failed resulting in low temperature (66 degrees F) in one animal room. The transgenic mice in the room were on a study that made them susceptible to low temperatures and one animal died. The animal was part of an NIH-funded activity.

Corrective and preventive actions included repairing the boiler and adjusting the room temperature to 78 – 80 degrees F to provide a warmer environment for the animals and a safety margin against low temperature.

The consideration of this matter by the University of Maryland – College Park was consistent with the philosophy of institutional self-regulation. Similarly, the actions taken to correct and prevent recurrence of the issue and provide a suitable environment were appropriate. We appreciate being informed of this matter and find no cause for further action by this office at this time.

Dear Dr. Morse:

The University of Maryland, College Park has finalized an issue that was previously self-reported to OLAW on May 2nd, 2019. On December 16th, 2018, an animal facility building experienced a boiler failure, which resulted in temperatures bypassing the low standard, to 66 °F, in one animal room. The transgenic mice housed in this room were on a longitudinal study involving iron deficiency anemia and therefore more susceptible to low temperatures. As a result, one animal died. This research was supported by NIH award DK085035.

Corrective actions:

Boiler repairs were completed, and temperature limits in this animal housing room were adjusted to create a warm room (78°F to 80°F temperature range), in order to ensure that the ambient temperatures never dip below levels tolerable for the animals undergoing experimental conditions and associated susceptibility to cold. Regular monitoring of temperatures in this room continues, including alerts for deviations in temperature.
