The Office of Laboratory Animal Welfare (OLAW) acknowledges receipt of your February 19, 2020 letter reporting an instance of noncompliance with the PHS Policy on Humane Care and Use of Laboratory Animals at The University of Iowa. According to the information provided, OLAW understands that on January 21, 2020 veterinary staff directed euthanasia of an animal on an active study and euthanasia was delayed due to necropsy scheduling efforts with the pathology laboratory. The animal was observed by laboratory staff and expired prior to euthanasia. Communication between the laboratory and veterinary staff during the monitoring period and following the death of the animal did not occur. The IACUC was promptly notified of the incident. The study was PHS supported.

As a corrective measure, the Principal Investigator (PI) met with the Attending Veterinarian, the Chair of the IACUC and the Director of the IACUC Office to discuss the non-compliance. The PI and lab manager were provided retraining. The IACUC Training and Compliance Manger (ITCM) is working with the laboratory to create a standard operating procedure (SOP) for communication with veterinary staff and upon completion of SOP, the lab members will be trained.

OLAW appreciates the prompt consideration of this matter by The University of Iowa which is consistent with the philosophy of institutional self-regulation. Based on the information provided, OLAW is satisfied that appropriate steps have been taken to investigate this incident and to attempt to prevent recurrence. OLAW reminds your organization that instances in which an animal's disposition extends beyond established humane endpoints are considered significant non-compliances and are of concern to OLAW. We appreciate being informed of this matter and please contact us with any further questions or concerns.

Dear Dr. Wolff:

This letter is to report an incident involving a ferret. The University of Iowa PHS Assurance Number is D16-00009 (A3021-01). The grant number affected is 75N92019R0014.

January 21, 2020: Veterinary staff directed euthanasia of an animal that was part of an important ongoing study. Euthanasia was acutely delayed owing to efforts by the lab to schedule a necropsy with the pathology lab. The animal was kept under close observation by laboratory staff and succumbed prior to being euthanized. Communication between the laboratory and veterinary staff during this monitoring period and following the death of the animal should have occurred but it did not.

The IACUC Office was promptly notified of the incident. The PI and lab manager were contacted and provided retraining. The AV, Chair, and Director of the IACUC Office met with the PI to discuss the matter. The IACUC Training and Compliance Manager (ITCM) is assisting the lab with the creation of a standard procedure (SOP) for all circumstances in which communication to the veterinary staff is required. Once complete, the ITCM and veterinary staff will conduct training sessions with lab members on the SOP.

February 12, 2020: The IACUC members discussed the incident at a convened meeting and voted to report to the appropriate agencies.
