The Office of Laboratory Animal Welfare (OLAW) acknowledges receipt of your July 1, 2019 letter reporting an instance of noncompliance with the PHS Policy on Humane Care and Use of Laboratory Animals at the University of Minnesota. According to the information provided, OLAW understands that forty mice were subjected to multiple facial vein bleeding procedures which had not been approved on the protocol.

The corrective actions consisted of amending the protocol and retraining staff on the requirement for following the protocol.

Based on its assessment of this explanation, OLAW understands that measures have been implemented to correct and prevent recurrence of this problem. OLAW concurs with the actions taken by the institution to comply with the PHS Policy.

In keeping with the terms of our assurance, please be informed that we are making a report of non-compliance of an IACUC approved, NIH funded study involving mice. The basis of this report results from a post approval monitoring inspection. The report outlined that forty mice had undergone multiple facial vein bleeding procedures that were not outlined in the approved protocol. This deviation of protocol occurred between the dates of March 18, 2019 through May 20, 2019.

We want to inform you that we consider this matter closed. An amendment was submitted to the IACUC for review and approval for bleeding of animals under this study. Further, staff were retrained as to approved procedures in their protocol.
