I am providing the Eastern Region Animal Care office a supplement to Purdue University's 2008 Annual Report. Purdue University's Registration Number is 32-R-0007. The Annual Report was completed and submitted in Final Form via electronic submission in November 2008.

The electronic submission process does not allow for attachment of a summary of any IACUC approved exceptions to the regulations or standards.

The Purdue University IACUC has granted one exception to the standards. Title of the approved protocol is Veterinary Clinical Sciences 518 and 520 Small Animal Surgical Laboratory.

The IACUC has approved the temporary holding of dogs in surgical recovery cages with smaller floor space than required by the regulations. Dogs are received at approximately 7:00 a.m. on the day of surgery and are held in the cages until approximately 12:00 noon. The dogs are then used in a non-survival surgical procedure. While the cages provide space for the dogs to make postural adjustments, the cages do not meet the criteria necessary for routine housing.

In the past year (October 1, 2007 through September 30, 2008) 92 dogs were affected by this exception.
