The Office of Laboratory Animal Welfare (OLAW) acknowledges receipt of your July 31, 2019 letter reporting an incident of noncompliance with the PHS Policy on Humane Care and Use of Laboratory Animals at Michigan State University. Your letter supplements the information in an emailed prompt report to this office on July 12, 2019. According to the information provided, OLAW understands that a laboratory staff member performed surgery on two rats on an expired protocol. There were no animal welfare issues and the animals were humanely euthanized. It is understood that the animal activities were funded by the PHS.

Corrective and preventive actions included a meeting with the IACUC Chair, PI, laboratory staff member, IACUC Administrator, Research Liaison, and Clinical Veterinarian to discuss the incident. The laboratory manager devised a plan of action for correction and prevention. In addition, the laboratory staff member was retrained on IACUC regulations and expectations, rodent surgery, and the use of rodents in MSU facilities.

OLAW believes that the corrective and preventative measures put in place by Michigan State University are consistent with the provisions of the PHS Policy on Humane Care and Use of Laboratory Animals. We appreciate being informed of this issue and find no cause for further action by this office.

There was a meeting with the Chair, PI, laboratory staff member, IACUC Administrator, Research Liaison, and Clinical Veterinarian to discuss incident. It was determined that the laboratory manager would devise a plan of action for correction and prevention which would be reviewed by the Chair. In addition, the laboratory staff member would be retrained on IACUC regulations and expectations, rodent surgery, and the use of rodents in MSU facilities. All training has been completed and the Chair approved the plan for prevention.

The IACUC discussed the incident at their July meeting and were satisfied with the actions to be taken.

Laboratory staff (MD, PhD) performed surgery on two rats on an expired protocol. This was discovered by animal care staff during routine checks. There were no animal welfare issues involved and the animals were humanely euthanized.

There will be a meeting with the PI and the laboratory staff were a plan of action for correction and prevention will be determined.

The IACUC was notified on 7/11/19 of the incident. A final report will be sent by August 1, 2019.
