- 2. Typographical errors in the sentence, "The training details, but is not limited to," were corrected to read the following: "The training details include, but are not limited to:"



<u>Subsection III.G.</u> -The training or instruction available to scientists, animal technicians, and other personnel involved in animal care, treatment, or use is as follows:

Summary of change:

- 1. The following paragraph was deleted because the information was accidentally repetitive and provided earlier in this section.
 - Mandatory employee safety training occurs prior to working in or around animal use areas. IACUC CITI training must be completed for all protocol-associated personnel prior to being assigned to an approved protocol. The CITI training for investigators, staff and students covers the importance of minimizing the number of animals required to obtain valid results by explaining the importance of alternatives (the 3 R's) and avoiding unnecessary duplication.
- 2. A formatting change was made to recognize the following, already included paragraph, as the fifth bullet for this section. The paragraph now reads:
 - 5. Additional Didactic and Hands-On Training: There are currently two types of species and protocol specific animal use training provided to investigators by DLAR staff. DLAR coordinates schedules and maintains documentation of participation for all hands-on animal use training at the Institute.
- 3. The formatting for all subsequent bullet numbers were changed in accordance with the change described above.
