Dear Ms. Chronister,

Thank you for your May 29, 2020 letter responding to our May 1st request for additional information regarding the Minority View that was attached to your 2019 Annual Report to OLAW which described housing animals (fish) without an approved protocol and without the knowledge of the IACUC or veterinarians. It is understood that the activity was not PHS funded.

Corrective and preventive actions included counseling of personnel involved and the IACUC approval of a protocol covering the housing of fish.

OLAW agrees with the consensus of the IACUC and that this issue *should* have been considered a significant deficiency. Since this activity was not PHS funded and if the IACUC considered this an isolated incident and therefore not a programmatic deficiency, the incident would *not* be required to be reported to OLAW.

We appreciate your cooperation by providing the requested information. Based on the information provided, OLAW is satisfied that appropriate actions have been taken to investigate this incident, correct the issue at hand, and prevent recurrence. We appreciate being informed of this matter and find no cause for further action by this office.

The purpose of this letter is to provide a written report of a non-compliance that occurred at the University of South Alabama (Assurance A3288-01) in May 2019. The species is *Archosargus probatocephalus*. This report is a response to the letter dated May 1, 2020, regarding a minority view memorandum attached to our OLAW 2019 Annual Report. In this communication from OLAW, it was requested that the IACUC "provide a description of the occurrence and all corrective/preventive actions." Additionally, the IACUC was asked to "consider if the occurrence represented a programmatic failure and why they determined it was not reportable to this Office." The IACUC determined the non-compliance incident was considered serious but would not be reported to OLAW. Rather, a minority view memorandum was attached to the 2019 Annual Report.

During spring 2019 semi-annual inspections, aquatic housing was inspected at the Dauphin Island Sea Laboratory (DISL). Several research projects performed at the DISL are affiliated with USA and are therefore under the jurisdiction of the USA IACUC.

On April 23, 2019 it was noted that there were mesocosms housing *Archosargus probatocephalus*, common name: sheepshead fish. A USA graduate student stated that they were holding the fish, pending approval of a submitted IACUC-protocol. The fish were being housed as per a previously approved (but expired) IACUC protocol for housing sheepshead fish. The Attending Veterinarian (AV) for USA was part of the aquatic housing inspection team and verified that the fish were housed appropriately and that they were in good condition. During the inspection, the graduate student was counseled to not use or euthanize the animals, pending an IACUC investigation.

The IACUC Chair and I were notified by the AV of the incident. The Program Review subcommittee appointed two IACUC members to investigate the circumstances of this occurrence. The two IACUC members contacted the PI, the graduate student, and research staff at the DISL. The investigative team presented the following to the full IACUC at the May 2019 meeting:

- 1. An angler who was familiar with the USA graduate student and knew she would be working with sheepshead fish brought several to the DISL for her.
- She accepted the fish and housed them in the tank, only planning to use them once a usage protocol was approved. The graduate student did not know that she needed an approved protocol to house the donated fish.

- 3. Sheepshead fish are seasonal and are hard to catch.
- 4. No experiments were carried out.
- 5. The fish could not be released from the dock because they are naturally found farther offshore.
- This was an isolated incident.
- Corrective action had already been initiated and included counseling the graduate student, the PI, and research staff, and submission for review and approval an umbrella protocol for temporary housing of fish species.

The full IACUC discussed this noncompliance at the May 16, 2019 meeting. After much deliberation, a vote was put forth to consider this noncompliance "minor" vs "significant" for the following reasons:

- 1. The fish were housed appropriately and would have perished had they been released.
- 2. This was an isolated incident.
- 3. The PI, the graduate student, and research staff were counseled and understood that an active housing was required for fish donated by anglers.
- 4. The mesocosms were well maintained by DISL and represent a housing paradigm like what is found in the field.

The committee voted in favor of considering this a "minor" deficiency identified during semi-annual inspections, with three dissenting votes. Those three members chose to write a minority view. This memorandum was attached to the OLAW Annual Report for 2019.

An additional motion was made to vote on the proposed corrective action plan (CAP): counseling of the graduate student, the PI, and research staff; and submission for review and approval of an umbrella protocol for temporary housing of fish species. The CAP was unanimously approved.

This occurrence was not reported to OLAW after the May 2019 meeting for the following reasons:

- No animals were harmed.
- 2. The studies were not funded by a PHS-awarding unit.
- 3. The IACUC voted to consider this a "minor" deficiency.

The full committee reviewed the letter from Dr. Morse dated May 1, 2020, the report from the two IACUC members who investigated the occurrence in May 2019, the memorandum containing the minority view as submitted with the 2019 Annual Report to OLAW, and the minutes from the May 16, 2019 IACUC meeting at a meeting which occurred on May 21, 2020. The IACUC discussed the concern(s) raised by OLAW Case Z, including whether this represented a programmatic failure. In the initial review of the incident, most of the committee voted that this was a minor deficiency (see reasoning detailed above) and not reportable to OLAW. As stated, a minority view was documented. Corrective action was immediately taken at the time of the incident and an approved protocol is now in place to prevent any further issues with housing of fish species.

After deliberation at the meeting on May 21, 2020, there was a consensus that this deficiency could have been considered a "significant" deficiency, but no motion was made to change the Semi-Annual Inspection report from Spring 2019. In addition, the committee noted that regardless of the designation of "significant" vs "minor" on the Semi-Annual report to me, the incident was serious and corrective action was taken.

On May 21st at the IACUC committee meeting, an additional motion was made by the Attending Veterinarian (AV). The motion brought forth was to consider the incident as a programmatic failure and to classify the incident as a "significant deficiency and programmatic failure". There was no voting member who seconded the motion. The IACUC noted that:

- No animals were harmed.
- 2. The incident was taken seriously.
- 3. Prompt corrective action was taken.
- 4. The IACUC had extensive discussions about this incident at the May 2019 and 2020 meetings.

Dear Ms. Chronister,

Upon review of your 2019 Annual Report to OLAW, our Division of Assurances referred the Minority View that was attached to the Division of Compliance Oversight. The minority View, dated May 16, 2019 from the Attending Veterinarian Dr. Schuler, describes housing of fish without an IACUC-approved protocol at the Dauphin Island Sea Lab. This was investigated by an IACUC subcommittee starting May 2, 2019 and reported to the full committee on May 16, 2019. The committee voted to consider this non-compliance as "minor" vs. "significant". Housing animals without an approved protocol and without the knowledge of the IACUC or veterinarians is a serious concern whether categorized as a significant deficiency or not.

Since corrective and preventive actions were not included in the Minority View letter, and as authorized under section V. A. 4. of the PHS Policy, and as referenced in your Animal Welfare Assurance for Humane Care and Use of Laboratory Animals, OLAW is requesting that your institution provide an explanation of the circumstances surrounding the above concern. Please instruct the IACUC, avoiding any conflict of interest, to send a report, signed by you as the Institutional Official, to the following OLAW email inbox: OLAWdco@od.nih.gov and provide a description of the occurrence and all corrective/preventive actions. Please have them consider if the occurrence represented a programmatic failure and why they determined it was not reportable to this Office. Please also include information regarding any PHS/NSF/DHHS funding of activities related to the occurrence, including grant or contract numbers.

During recent semi-annual inspections, an investigator affiliated with the Dauphin Island Sea Lab was observed to be housing fish for which there was no IACUC-approved protocol. No animals were in any distress and the housing was appropriate for the species.

This non-compliance was reported to the subcommittee performing Program Review on May 2, 2019. The committee members present recommended that two members of the committee should further investigate this noncompliance as per the AAALAC Program Description and established USA-IACUC procedures for Investigating reports of noncompliance. Findings of this investigation were reported to the full committee at the May 16, 2019 meeting.

After a thorough discussion, the committee voted to consider this noncompliance to be "minor" based on the following factors:

- The mesocosm where the fish were housed is an extension of the gulf waters;
- 2. No experiments were performed;
- The fish were donated by an angler who was unaware of IACUC regulations;
- 4. The fish donated were deep-water dwellers and would have perished if released in the shallow waters;
- The fish were housed appropriately;
- The graduate student did not realize that housing these animals was not approved by the IACUC and was included on a "pending" protocol; and
- An IACUC protocol to use the fish was already under IACUC's review at the time of the semi-annual inspection and the protocol was approved on April 24, 2019.

Regardless of all of the above considerations, three members of the IACUC

(b) (6) did not support the vote and felt that this noncompliance should be classified as "significant." Our rationale for this opinion was that regardless of the reasoning detailed above, animals were housed without assignment to an IACUC-approved protocol for approximately three weeks prior to the semi-annual inspection. During this timeframe, the PI did not contact the IACUC to discuss expedited protocol review or to report that animals had been donated and that there was no protocol on which to house them. As per our Assurance A3288-01 and our AAALAC Program Description, animal work (including housing of animals for research purposes) cannot be initiated prior to the protocol's approval date.

The proposed Corrective Action Plan was unanimously approved by the committee regardless of the designation of "minor" or "significant" of the noncompliance.
