The Office of Laboratory Animal Welfare (OLAW) acknowledges receipt of your February 27, 2020 letter reporting an instance of noncompliance with the PHS Policy on Humane Care and Use of Laboratory Animals at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill, following up on an initial telephone report on December 4, 2019. According to the information provided, OLAW understands that a graduate student attempted to perform a perfusion on a mouse that was not under a surgical plane of anesthesia.

The corrective actions consisted of the Principal Investigator revoking the student's animal use privileges and removing the student from the protocol. The laboratory staff was retrained on perfusion, anesthetic techniques, and reporting animal concerns.

Based on its assessment of this explanation, OLAW understands that measures have been implemented to correct and prevent recurrence of this problem. OLAW concurs with the actions taken by the institution to comply with the PHS Policy.

Please find notice of the Institutional Animal Care and Use Committee's (IACUC) investigation and report of a recent animal welfare concern.

On November 25, 2019, a Principal Investigator (PI) self-reported that a graduate student in their lab had previously attempted to perfuse a mouse that had not reached a surgical plane of anesthesia. The PI reported this to the IACUC as soon as they were made aware of the incident. The PI also personally retrained the lab members in the perfusion and anesthetic techniques and discussed the animal reporting protocol and animal welfare guidelines. The PI removed the graduate student from the protocol as well as the student's access to the animal facilities.

After gathering information and informing the Animal Concern Subcommittee (ACS), the Office of Animal Care and Use (OACU) staff verbally reported this incident to OLAW on December 4, 2019.

The ACS members agreed that the PI's response was adequate and requested that the OACU and Division of Comparative Medicine (DCM) perform additional retraining of current lab members in the perfusion technique, anesthetic administration, and animal reporting guidelines before any further surgical procedures were performed.

The IACUC met to discuss the case on January 10, 2020. The IACUC accepted the ACS recommendations and determined that no additional actions were required, no sanctions were warranted, and a report should be made to OLAW. NIH funds were used to support this project. The IACUC determined that the Animal Concern Report (ACR) would remain open until all required training was conducted.

DCM and OACU staff conducted the trainings as soon as possible after the winter holidays on January 15, January 21, and January 23. The IACUC met on February 12, 2020 and voted unanimously to accept the ACS recommendations and close the ACR.


Dear Dr. Wolff,
