Dear Dr. Magnuson,

The Office of Laboratory Animal Welfare (OLAW) acknowledges receipt of your May 14, 2019 letter reporting an instance of noncompliance with the PHS Policy on Humane Care and Use of Laboratory Animals at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill, following up on an initial telephone report on February 14, 2019. According to the information provided, OLAW understands that cardiac survival surgery was performed on zebrafish without oversight by a veterinarian as stipulated in a protocol amendment. The surgeon had not been certified by a veterinarian to perform surgery on live fish.

The corrective actions consisted of the Institutional Animal Care and Use Committee (IACUC) requiring a meeting of the Principal Investigator, veterinarian, an IACUC member, and the Training and Compliance Manager to explain the requirements for training of the surgeons.


Based on its assessment of this explanation, OLAW understands that measures have been implemented to prevent recurrence of this problem. OLAW concurs with the actions taken by the IACUC to comply with the PHS Policy.



Part I: Animal Concern Subcommitte	ee (ACS) Report	

 Concern/Allegation: The PI submitted an amendment in July 2018, to remove analogsia from the post-operative care regimen for zebra fish that received cardiac apex resection survival surgery. As part of the amendment review process, the DCM Veterinary reviewer required that the surgical procedure be observed, and the fish be monitored post-operatively by a DCM veterinarian prior to approval of the amendment. IACUC representatives reviewed records in the months following, indicating that two surgeons had performed survival surgery on fish, without prior observation by the DCM Vet. The first incident was handled via Significant Deficiency comment in the Post Approval Monitoring report. In the second, discovered later, the issue was elevated to Animal Concern. The PI's responses indicated that they had been confused with proper procedure for this observation and subsequent approval process. During IACUC review of the case, at the March 8, 2019 meeting, the IACUC indicated that a face to face meeting shall be scheduled to ensure that the PI and the IACUC are completely clear on expectations going forward for surgical training with survival surgeons in the lab.

The face to face meeting, mentioned above, was held on March 28, 2019, and included the PI, a DCM Veterinarian, an IACUC Member familiar with the PI and the case, and the TCM. The group agreed upon a plan and a process going forward, and this information was provided to the PI via email on April 3, 2019.

<u>Findings of Fact</u>: Despite requirements for certification by a DCM veterinarian, an uncertified surgeon performed surgeries on live fish.

 Subcommittee Recommendations: OACU reported this incident to the ACS on February 7, 2019.

The subcommittee recommendations along with the PI's response was presented to the IACUC at the March 8, 2019 meeting.
