Dear Dr. Magnuson,

The Office of Laboratory Animal Welfare (OLAW) acknowledges receipt of your February 15, 2019 letter reporting an instance of noncompliance with the PHS Policy on Humane Care and Use of Laboratory Animals at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill, following up on an initial telephone report on January 10, 2019. According to the information provided, OLAW understands that one of two analgesics described in the protocol was not being used in a survival mouse procedure and the one being used had expired. Six mice and one rat received the expired analgesic.

The corrective actions consisted of maintaining a log of the expiration dates of all surgical drugs and ordering new surgery drugs three months prior to expiration. A procedure checklist will be used which lists use of the intra-operative analgesic.

Based on its assessment of this explanation, OLAW understands that measures have been implemented to correct and prevent recurrence of this problem. OLAW concurs with the actions taken by the institution to comply with the PHS Policy.

Part I: Animal Concern Subcomm	ittee (ACS) Report

- 1) Concern & Summary of Events: On December 5, 2018 the OACU TCC performed a semiannual lab inspection and procedural observation with the PI. During the procedural observation, the PI explained that the lab did not utilize one of the two analgesics as described in the protocol for survival mouse procedures (intraoperative bupivacaine). The analgesic used (banamine) was past its expiration date (by one month) when used as the sole source of post-operative analgesia in six mice. Additionally, one rat received both bupivacaine and the expired banamine.
- 2) Principal Investigator (PI) Response:

The PI took responsibility for the incident and has started a log of the expiration dates of all surgical drugs, that will be attached to the surgery instrument box. Thus, the expiration dates will be validated before every procedure. Also, the PI implemented a process to order new surgery drugs three (3) months prior to the expiration date.

The PI has also implemented a a procedural checklist that includes as a step the infiltration of the bupivacaine prior to the incision.

- 3) Findings of Fact, Conclusions, and ACS Recommendations:
 - a) Standards:

Failure to adhere to approved IACUC protocol Use of expired analgesic

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- b) Findings of Fact: Seven animals (six mice and one rat) were given an expired analgesic. Six mice did not receive intra-operative analgesia as described in approved protocol.
- c) Subcommittee Recommendations: OACU reported this incident to the ACS on 12/14/2018. The PI investigated the issue of expired banamine and lack of intra-operative analgesics in the mouse surgeries and provided proposed actions to be taken to prevent future occurrences.

All ACS members agreed that the PI's proposed actions were satisfactory and no sanctions were warranted. The ACS deemed these issues reportable to OLAW; therefore, the ACR process was initiated following the deficiency inspection report.

NIH funds were not used to support this project.

The subcommittee recommendations along with the PI's proposed actions were presented to the IACUC at the January 11, 2019 meeting.
