Dear Dr. Magnuson,

The Office of Laboratory Animal Welfare (OLAW) acknowledges receipt of your February 15, 2019 letter reporting an instance of noncompliance with the PHS Policy on Humane Care and Use of Laboratory Animals at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill, following up on an initial telephone report on October 31, 2018. According to the information provided, OLAW understands that one mouse died and three required euthanasia after being subjected to retro-orbital bleeding which was not approved in the protocol. Also, the monitoring cards had been filled out in advance. The same investigator improperly euthanized mice with CO2.

The corrective actions consisted of retraining the investigator, having the investigator work with a second person until all retraining has been completed, and allowing retro-orbital bleeding only on euthanized mice (or amend the protocol).

Based on its assessment of this explanation, OLAW understands that measures have been implemented to correct and prevent recurrence of this problem. OLAW concurs with the actions taken by the institution to comply with the PHS Policy.

Animal Concern Subcommittee (ACS) Report Part I:

1) Concern/Allegation/Summary: A researcher performed the technique of retro-orbital bleeds on a group of mice when such technique was not described within the approved protocol. Several mice treated with this technique were found dead or required euthanasia. Additionally, the same researcher allegedly prematurely completed the purple cards used for monitoring of these animals making it impossible to correctly determine the actual time/frequency of monitoring.

Upon discovery of the animals at issue, DCM Vet Services alerted the research group, and advised, in two separate communications, that they report the unapproved activity to the IACUC. Although the laboratory member who performed the technique was certified to do so, the technique was not described in the approved protocol.

The researcher at issue was also involved in a separate instance of improperly euthanizing mice via CO2 in the animal facility. Although, the CO2 issue was initially handled by the OACU via email to the PI and LAC, it is deemed to be relevant to the overall conduct of the individual and was, therefore, included in the allegation notice for the PI to address.

The PI accepted full responsibility for the issues stated in the allegation notice related to the CO2 and for use of the unapproved technique. The PI acknowledged that the technique is not approved under the current protocol and, by way of explanation, noted that the technique was included on a previous protocol that had expired without the researcher realizing it.

2) Findings of Fact, Conclusions, and ACS Recommendations:

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a) Standards: IACUC Approved Protocol University Standard for Mouse and Rat Euthanasia

- b) Findings of Fact: One mouse was found dead and three required euthanasia after retro-orbital bleeds were performed, inconsistent with the approved protocol. Additionally, the researcher inaccurately documented monitoring time on purple cards and, in an earlier incident, did not follow protocol for euthanasia via CO2.
- c) Subcommittee Recommendations: OACU reported this incident to the ACS on 10/24/2018. The PI investigated the following issues: performing a technique not described within an approved protocol; premature documentation of monitoring; and performing CO2 euthanasia in a manner not approved by the IACUC euthanasia standard. The PI provided proposed actions to be taken to prevent future occurrences.

All ACS members agreed that the PI's proposed actions were satisfactory and suggested retraining of the researcher on proper euthanasia technique and protocol compliance. Two ACS members indicated that the researcher involved should be required to work in the presence of a second lab member until retraining is completed.

NIH funds were not used to support this project. The subcommittee recommendations along with DCM's proposed actions will be presented to the IACUC at the November 2, 2018 meeting.

Part II: IACUC Conclusion and Report to Institutional Official

- 1) IACUC Meeting Date and Closure: November 2, 2018. The IACUC accepted the ACS recommendations and required that the researcher named in this ACR receive the following retraining: hands-on retroorbital bleeding and CO2 euthanasia techniques and the online IACUC Orientation. The researcher was retrained by the TCM on 11/7/2018, and was advised to take the online IACUC Orientation as soon as possible.
- 2) Additional Requirement(s): The IACUC indicated that should further retroorbital bleeds be required for this or future studies, they must be conducted after euthanasia, or an amendment must be approved to include the technique in the PI's current protocol.
