The Office of Laboratory Animal Welfare (OLAW) acknowledges receipt of your November 27, 2019 letter reporting an instance of noncompliance with the PHS Policy on Humane Care and Use of Laboratory Animals at the University of Pittsburgh. According to the information provided, OLAW understands that mice failed to receive the post-surgical analgesia described in the approved protocol.

The corrective actions consisted of counseling the laboratory staff to perform all procedures as described in the protocol, having the laboratory staff become familiar with new procedures before performing them, issuing a letter of reprimand to the Principal Investigator (PI) and supervisor, placing the laboratory under enhanced post-approval monitoring, retraining the PI and staff on protocol adherence, and informing the investigator about use of data acquired under noncompliant conditions.

Based on the information provided, OLAW is satisfied that appropriate actions have been taken to investigate, correct, and prevent recurrence of the noncompliance. We appreciate having been informed about this matter and find no cause for further action by this Office.

Dear Dr. Morse:

As the Institutional Official responsible for the University of Pittsburgh's Animal Care and Use Program (IACUC) (Assurance number D16-00118), I am writing to report an incident discovered on September 24, 2019 wherein several boxes of mice covered by the investigator's IACUC protocol underwent surgical procedures in January 2019 but were not administered the post-operative analgesic specified in the protocol. The protocol stated that mice will receive buprenorphine twice a day for three days after surgery.

The University of Pittsburgh IACUC reviewed and accepted the investigator's corrective action plan (CAP), which consisted of the following item:

1. Laboratory staff will review the protocol to ensure that they understand which procedures are approved and exactly how to perform the procedures.

2. Prior to either beginning a new procedure or performing a procedure that has not been performed recently, individual staff will re-familiarize themselves with the protocol.

The IACUC has levied the following sanctions:

1. A letter of reprimand was sent to the Principal Investigator and his/her supervisor regarding this violation. The letter has been placed in our files as evidence of a violation.

2. For a six-month period, the investigator's animal research activities will be subject to

enhanced monitoring by the Compliance Officer.

3. The investigator and laboratory staff will undergo training on protocol adherence.

4. The investigator was reminded that any data collected from studies involving off-protocol work represents work not approved by the IACUC, and that said data cannot be used in support of grant applications or publications without disclosing this fact.
