The Office of Laboratory Animal Welfare (OLAW) acknowledges receipt of your August 29, 2017 letter reporting an instance of noncompliance with the PHS Policy on Humane Care and Use of Laboratory Animals at the University of South Carolina. According to the information provided, OLAW understands that two rats were subjected to a subcutaneous implantation via trocar although this activity was not covered by an approved protocol, was not performed as described in a pending amendment, and was performed by an individual involved in a prior unauthorized surgery. Also, unapproved post-procedure suturing was performed, analgesia was not provided, and the veterinary staff was not consulted. The institutional animal protocol transfer had not been properly conducted.

The corrective actions consisted of counseling the investigator to follow the animal protocol transfer procedures before using animals, having the individual responsible undertake retraining, resubmitting a revised detailed protocol amendment, and confirming proficiency of staff performing the trocar implantation procedure.

Based on its assessment of this explanation, OLAW understands that measures have been implemented to correct and prevent recurrence of the problem. OLAW concurs with the actions taken by the institution to comply with the PHS Policy. Please notify the funding components for grants #R01 DA013137 and R01 MH 106392 that no charges will be made for any unauthorized animal activities. Thank you for informing OLAW about this matter.

Dear Dr. Wolff:

The University of South Carolina, in accordance with Assurance D16-00028 and PHS Policy IV.F.3., provides this report regarding a recent case of non-compliance. The non-compliance occurred on PHS-funded, NIH grant numbers R01 DA013137 and R01 MH106392.

On July 7, 2017, DLAR staff discovered two rats being held in cages marked "Pilot Project" and they appeared to have undergone a procedure which was not covered by the relevant animal use protocol (AUP). Subsequently, the PI submitted a transfer request to move the animals onto what was, ostensibly, the correct AUP. A subcommittee of the IACUC was appointed to review the incident. The subcommittee requested that the PI provide detailed information about the procedures, including how they fit within the approved AUP. The requested information was provided on August 2, 2017.

At its meeting on August 3, 2017, the IACUC fully reviewed all correspondence and evidence connected with this matter and concluded the following:

- 1. The procedure in question (subcutaneous implantation via trocar) was not approved on either of the protocols in question.
- 2. The procedure was performed by the same individual who performed a prior unauthorized surgery.
- 3. The procedure was not performed as described in a pending amendment to AUP #2205 or according to the PI's email message of August 2, 2017.

4. Post-procedure suturing constitutes an additional unapproved procedure, compounded by failure to provide appropriate care. It was performed without veterinary consultation or provision of analgesia.

Based on these findings the IACUC required the following corrective actions:

- 1. The established procedure for transferring animals to protocols must be followed. All transfers must be requested and approved prior to animal use on the receiving protocol.
- 2. The individual who performed the procedure must undergo compliance training as follows; complete or re-take the following AALAS Learning Library modules before September 15, 2017 or his approval to work with animals and his facility access will be revoked:
  - a. PHS Policy on Humane Care & Use of Laboratory Animals
  - b. Animal Welfare Act Regulations
  - c. 8th Edition of the Guide for the Care & Use of Laboratory Animals
  - d. Working with the IACUC (not the refresher)
  - e. Common Compliance Issues
  - f. Pain Management in Laboratory Animals
- 3. The pending amendment to AUP 2205-100886-082114 cannot be approved. It must be resubmitted and include the following information:
  - a. A complete description of the procedure, including information regarding suturing;
  - b. The type of anesthesia, if any, that will be used for the procedure;
  - c. Description of what will be injected, including doses and volumes as appropriate.
- 4. All protocol associates who will perform subcutaneous implantation via trocar must demonstrate proficiency in the procedure via observation by appropriate DLAR staff before conducting the procedure on any approved protocols.
