Dear Dr. Blackburn,

The Office of Laboratory Animal Welfare (OLAW) acknowledges receipt of your January 31, 2020 letter reporting an instance of noncompliance with the PHS Policy on Humane Care and Use of Laboratory Animals at UTHealth following up on an initial January 28, 2020 notification by telephone.

According to the information provided, this Office understands that UTHealth Animal Welfare Committee (AWC) determined that instances of noncompliance occurred with respect to: unapproved personnel manipulating animals. The final report states a qualified and trained individual performed protocol approved behavioral tests on 16 rats between January 3 and January 21, 2020. The Principal Investigator has several approved protocols a majority of which, include behavioral testing that was performed by a senior lab member who recently left the lab. The individual responsible for this incident assumed the duties of behavioral testing, but due to an oversight the person was never added as personnel on the protocol for which this incident occurred. The report states no clinical consequences to the animals resulted from this incident. An amendment to add the individual was submitted on January 23 and approved by the AWC on January 27, 2020. It is noted this incident was supported by NIH funding, and no significant costs associated with this event were identified.

Based on its assessment of this explanation, OLAW understands that UTHealth has implemented appropriate measures to correct and prevent recurrences of these problems and is now compliant with provisions of the PHS Policy. We appreciate being informed of these matters and find no cause for further action by this Office.

The Animal Welfare Committee (AWC), the Institutional Animal Care and Use Committee for the University of Texas Health Science Center at Houston (UTHealth) provides this report of unapproved personnel manipulating animals. In accordance with Assurance A3413-01 and PHS Policy IV.F.3.a., a preliminary report was made by the (b) (6) (6) to you on January 28, 2020.

On January 21, 2020, the AWC received a report of unapproved personnel manipulating animals. Specifically, the individual responsible for this incident performed approved behavioral tests on sixteen rats between January 3 and January 21, 2020. Although the individual was appropriately qualified and trained, the individual was not listed as approved personnel on the protocol for which this incident occurred. The Principle Investigator has several approved protocols a majority of which have approved behavioral testing that was performed by a senior laboratory member who recently left the laboratory. Consequently, the individual responsible for this incident took over the responsibilities for performing the behavioral testing as this individual is listed as approved personnel on the other protocols. Because of an oversight the individual was never added as personnel on the protocol for which this incident occurred. No clinical consequences to the animals resulted from this incident.

The individual was not allowed to manipulate any animals until the personnel amendment request was submitted and approved. A protocol amendment to add the individual was submitted on January 23 and approved by the AWC on January 27, 2020.

The animals involved in this incident were supported by NIH funding (5RO1NS090935-05). No significant costs associated with this event were identified. Funds will be returned if associated costs are identified.

The AWC Protocol Deviation Subcommittee has investigated the incident, evaluated the corrective action plan, and feels that the incident has been successfully resolved.
