The Office of Laboratory Animal Welfare (OLAW) acknowledges receipt of your January 22, 2020 letter reporting a serious deviation from the provisions of the *Guide for the Care and Use of Laboratory Animals* at the University of Texas Health Science Center at Houston, following up on an initial telephone report on December 23, 2019. According to the information provided, OLAW understands that one pig was not fed on one day. The pig did receive food enrichment and was not adversely affected due to the missed feeding.

The immediate action taken upon discovery consisted of providing the required daily feed. The animal caretaker responsible was counseled and removed from weekend duty.

Based on its assessment of this explanation, OLAW understands that measures have been implemented to correct and prevent recurrence of this problem. OLAW concurs with the actions taken by the institution to comply with the PHS Policy on Humane Care and Use of Laboratory Animals.

The Animal Welfare Committee (AWC), the Institutional Animal Care and Use Committee for the University of Texas Health Science Center at Houston (UTHealth) provides this report of non-compliance involving a single incident whereby animal care staff did not provide the daily feed ration to a single pig. In accordance with Assurance A3413-01 and PHS Policy IV.F.3.a., a preliminary report was made by the

On December 16, 2019, the AWC received a report involving a single incident whereby animal care staff did not provide the daily amount of feed ration to a single pig. Specifically, Center for Laboratory Animal Medicine and Care (CLAMC) staff did not provide the daily required amount of feed to the pig on December 14, 2019. Per the approved AWC protocol, the pig should be fed daily. The pig did, however, receive food enrichment on December 14 and December 15 when this incident was discovered. This oversight was immediately corrected on December 15, by providing the pig the daily amount of feed required. No adverse clinical consequences resulted from this single incident as the pig was bright, alert, and active at the time of the incident.

Although the active facility room list included the specific house room where this incident occurred, the weekend CLAMC husbandry attendant still failed to feed this pig. The husbandry attendant was counseled by the CLAMC assistant director and will no longer be assigned to weekend duty in the future.

The animals involved in this incident were supported by NIH funding (1R01HL135092-01). No significant costs associated with this event were identified. Funds will be returned if associated costs are identified.

The AWC Protocol Deviation Subcommittee has investigated the incident, evaluated the corrective action plan, and feels that the incident has been successfully resolved.
