The Office of Laboratory Animal Welfare (OLAW) acknowledges receipt of your February 12, 2019 letter reporting an instance of noncompliance with the PHS Policy on Humane Care and Use of Laboratory Animals at the University of Michigan. According to the information provided, OLAW understands that seventeen live mice were found in a carcass disposal bag due to a failure to use a secondary physical method to ensure death following exposure to CO2 for euthanasia.

The immediate action taken upon discovery consisted of appropriately euthanizing the mice. The laboratory staff in the unit where this occurred were retrained on the appropriate conduct of euthanasia.

Based on its assessment of this explanation, OLAW understands that measures have been implemented to correct and prevent recurrence of this problem. OLAW concurs with the actions taken by the institution to comply with the PHS Policy.

Dear Dr. Wolff:

The University of Michigan (U-M), in accordance with Assurance A3114-01 and the Public Health Service Policy on Humane Care and Use of Laboratory Animals (PHS Policy), provides this report of noncompliance occurring at the U-M. The IACUC discussed this matter on Monday, December 3, 2018.

Specifically, an effective secondary method of euthanasia was not performed on at least seventeen mice that were euthanized using gas asphyxiation. During daily observations, members of the veterinary team noticed that at least seventeen mice placed in a plastic bag for disposal after euthanasia (i.e., carbon dioxide asphyxiation) recovered. Members of the veterinary team upon discovery immediately euthanized the animals.

Although the IACUC was unable to identify the specific research team responsible for the oversight, the committee was able to identify the responsible institutional unit. Consequently, veterinarians provided supplemental training to the relevant parties on proper methods of euthanasia including information as to when a secondary method of euthanasia is required, and how to conduct secondary methods of euthanasia. Given this is an isolated incident, and that the relevant parties received supplemental training from staff veterinarians, the U-M IACUC believes the chance of future occurrences is minimal.
