Dear Dr. Calzonetti,

The Office of Laboratory Animal Welfare (OLAW) acknowledges receipt of your September 23, 2019 letter reporting the suspension of a PHS funded animal activity at the University of Toledo.

According to the information provided, OLAW understands that the activity was a breeding protocol and on September 10, 2019 the Department of Laboratory Animal Resources reported that the laboratory was not reporting animal numbers. Because this was the second serious non-compliance for this laboratory in the last six months the Institutional Animal Care and Use Committee (IACUC) voted to suspend the protocol until the laboratory arranged for personnel to conduct dedicated colony management. Based on its assessment of this explanation, OLAW concurs with the actions taken by the IACUC to comply with the PHS Policy. Note that suspensions of animal activities on PHS-supported studies must be reported to the funding component. In addition, please notify this Office if or when the protocol is re-instated, and for future reports please provide the species of animal and the date of suspension. Thank you for keeping OLAW apprised on this matter.

Dear Dr Wolff:

In accordance with Assurance A3414-01 and PHS Policy IV.F.3., The University of Toledo (UToledo) provides this report of continuing noncompliance, reported to the IACUC on September 18, 2019.

On September 10, 2019, the Department of Laboratory Animal Resources (DLAR) reported to the IACUC that animal numbers were not being reported by a laboratory for a breeding protocol. This was the second serious non-compliance related to breeding reported to the IACUC in the last six months for this laboratory that the committee needed to address. Therefore, the IACUC voted to suspend the protocol until a formal arrangement was made for dedicated breeding colony management. The laboratory was given the option of hiring a Laboratory Technician or Manager to run the breeding colony or hiring DLAR to manage breeding colony operations. Until this is accomplished, the breeding protocol remains suspended.

NIH funds were used on this project.

Hello Ms. Tignor,

Attached please find (b) (6) final response to OLAW Case A3414-U and the relevant notices regarding charging to a grant during a suspension: https://grants.nih.gov/grants/guide/notice-files/NOT-OD-10-081.html. Yes, you should place a restriction on the notice of award and only allow expenses for maintenance and housing (this decision actually rests with the funding component but is commonly used during suspensions).

You could use the term "pending IACUC approvals" because the actual animal work cannot begin until there is IACUC approval or re-approval. Once this is received, the grant can once again be charged for animal research activities.

Hi Susann,

We have just received an email message from the Division of Compliance Oversight regarding suspension of IACUC approval due to serious non-compliance issue relating to NIH grant number 5R01HD081792. I've attached the suspension letter here.

We would like to get some guidance about this situation. It appears that a restriction on the notice of award should be placed restricting all activities and expenditures involving animal research and permitting only expenses for animal housing and maintenance.

We have a standard term for "pending IACUC approvals." Are there additional or perhaps other terms that should be placed on the notice of award, steps that should be taken?

We will also reach out to the institution regarding any charges related to animal research since the suspension.

I appreciate any guidance on this issue.
