Dear Dr. Calzonetti,

The Office of Laboratory Animal Welfare (OLAW) acknowledges receipt of your July 15, 2020 letter reporting an instance of noncompliance with the PHS Policy on Humane Care and Use of Laboratory Animals at the University of Toledo, following up on an initial telephone report on July 13, 2020. According to the information provided, OLAW understands that nine mice died of post-operative infections after receiving a contaminated diluted analgesic which had been improperly stored. In addition, a student in this laboratory failed to adequately monitor mice post-operatively and then falsified the records. The protocol is supported by grant #5R01HD081792.

The corrective actions consisted of the Institutional Animal Care and Use Committee (IACUC) suspending the protocol, requiring the investigator to develop a laboratory and protocol management plan, and requiring the investigator to hire a laboratory manager to oversee the laboratory. The Office of Research Integrity is involved regarding the records falsification.

Based on its assessment of this explanation, OLAW understands that measures have been implemented to correct and prevent recurrence of this problem. OLAW concurs with the actions taken by the IACUC to comply with the PHS Policy. Please also inform the NIH funding component about the suspension and ensure that the grant is not charged for any unauthorized animal activities. Thank you for keeping OLAW apprised on this matter.

Dear Dr. Wolff:

In accordance with Assurance A3414-01 and PHS Policy IV.F.3., The University of Toledo (UToledo) provides this report of continuing noncompliance, reported to the IACUC on July 15, 2020.

On June 18-2020, it was discovered that nine mice died of post-operative infections over a two-month period. It was subsequently discovered these deaths were lined the use of contaminated, diluted Meloxicam that had been stored by the laboratory at room temperature for an extended period of time.

This same laboratory failed to monitor mice post-operatively on three separate occasions in June and falsified post-operative records. The student involved is working with the Office of Research Integrity on this incident.

Due to the history of non-compliance in the protocol, the IACUC has voted to suspend the protocol effective immediately. The investigator must submit a formal management plan to the IACUC for the protocol and the laboratory. This management must include at least a part-time FTE Lab Manager to manage the laboratory and protocol. I have contacted the College Dean, who has promised to take action. Until this is accomplished, the protocol remains suspended.

NIH funds were used on this project.
