Dear Dr. Monroe,

The Office of Laboratory Animal Welfare (OLAW) acknowledges receipt of your March 5, 2019 letter reporting an instance of noncompliance with the PHS Policy on Humane Care and Use of Laboratory Animals at the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention – Ft. Collins. According to the information provided, OLAW understands that three sentinel mice were euthanized by CO₂, but cervical dislocation was not performed to ensure death. This is contrary to institutional policy and the approved sentinel mice protocol.

The corrective actions consisted of amending the protocol to clarify euthanasia and retraining the veterinary residents responsible. The Compliance Officer was counseled on conducting post-approval monitoring involving contract staff.

Based on its assessment of this explanation, OLAW understands that measures have been implemented to prevent recurrence of this problem. OLAW concurs with the actions taken by the institution to comply with the PHS Policy on Humane Care and Use of Laboratory Animals.



Fort Collins Institutional Animal Care and Use Committee (IACUC)

This memorandum is to inform you of a reportable incident that occurred at the Division of Vector-Borne Diseases (DVBD) in Fort Collins, CO that the IACUC recommends reporting to OLAW.

On December 13, 2018, the IACUC Administrator/Compliance Officer performed a Post-Approval Monitoring (PAM) visit for a sentinel mice protocol. Necropsies were performed during the PAM visit according to the protocol requirements for sentinel mice. The IACUC Administrator/Compliance Officer observed that the resident veterinarians who performed the necropsies did not conduct cervical dislocations to assure death after administering CO₂ to 3 mice, as is required by DVBD IACUC policy as well as the protocol for sentinel mice monitoring.

The IACUC was informed of this non-compliance to both protocol and policy at an IACUC meeting held on January 8, 2019. At that time, the IACUC voted unanimously to consider this incident a non-compliance issue, as well as a reportable incident. The IACUC requested that the Principle Investigator (PI) submit an amendment to the protocol to clarify when various biological samples were obtained and to clarify euthanasia and confirmation of euthanasia. The IACUC requested that the resident veterinarians be retrained to perform tasks related to the sentinel mice protocol as written in both the amended protocol and the IACUC policy. Retraining of the residents was conducted on February 28, 2019. The IACUC also requested that the Compliance Officer receive guidance on the conduct of post-approval monitoring of protocols involving contractors. This will occur on March 6, 2019.

Because the method of euthanasia used was not performed according to the protocol or the IACUC policy, this is considered a non-compliance and this incident is reportable to OLAW.


