Two changes have been made to our program for animal care and use.

- 1) The institution name has changed from PreClinical Research Services, Inc. to Inotiv (separate letter submitted from the IO). The IO is still Donald H. Maul, DVM, MS, ACLAM; however, his title is now Senior Vice President, Surgical Models.
- 2) The IACUC policy for protocol amendment review has been revised to include Veterinary Verification and Consultation (VVC). Significant changes to the protocol, as defined in the policy, still must be submitted to the IACUC via DMR or FCR. The VVC covers changes to the IACUC protocol that may be handled administratively without IACUC review by FCR or DMR. The Attending Veterinarian or Staff Veterinarian may approve the changes through VVC. These changes briefly include: change in strain or source; increase in animal number for non-USDA species; change in planned anesthesia, analgesia, sedation, or other clinically relevant medication; changes in experimental substance administration or biological sample collection (e.g. dose, route, frequency, etc.); change in instrumentation (e.g. suture); change in study endpoint; and change in final disposition. The policy includes guidelines and published references for changes that can be approved by VVC, and also stipulates that the procedures cannot alter the objectives of the original proposal, create welfare concerns, or result in increased pain, distress, or invasiveness.
