 Dr. Schabdach has 28 years of laboratory animal veterinary medicine and IACUC experience providing medical, surgical, and multidiscipline research for studies utilizing rodents, dogs, nonhuman primates, and a variety of other species in commercial and academic environments.

Authority:

As Attending Veterinarian, Dr. Schabdach has direct program authority and responsibility for the Institution's animal care and use program and has access to all animals. He is responsible for ensuring that "adequate veterinary care" is provided to all animals used in teaching and research at Virginia Tech, including but not limited to:

 ensuring the provision of adequate veterinary care consistent with current professional standards in the areas of

- o preventive medicine,
- o disease surveillance, diagnosis, treatment, and control,
- o management of protocol related animal concerns,
- o anesthesia and analgesia,
- o surgery and perioperative care, and
- o animal welfare and well-being;
- ensuring that clinical veterinary records are maintained in accordance with federal regulations, industry guidelines, and institutional requirements;
- providing oversight for animal biosecurity to meet the institutional needs including preventive health programs, monitoring animal colony health, and assessing animal sources and suppliers;
- ensuring that euthanasia is conducted in a humane manner and consistent with the current AVMA euthanasia guidelines;
- providing oversight for animal housing and husbandry practices;
- consulting with PIs on animal model selection and development, experimental techniques, and available alternatives;
- advising investigators on the appropriate use of anesthesia, analgesia, and other methods to relieve or reduce pain and distress; and
- collaborating with Environmental Health and Safety to ensure personnel safety when working with animals and performing IACUC approved experimental procedures, including the use of hazardous materials.
