 This institution's program for animal care and use has changed. In on-going efforts to align the animal care program with our OLAW Assurance, and to strengthen the Program overall, some changes have been made.

Standard Operating Procedures (SOPs): The IACUC has and continues reviewing (at least every six months) and modifying (as needed), its written Standard Operating Procedures (SOPs) governing the actions of the IACUC, researchers and the Animal Care & Use Program at CSI. These SOPs are consistent with CSI's PHS Assurance. The IACUC continues utilizing the Guide, federal and local laws, as well as the Veterinary Medical Association's requirements as references in all decision-making.

Last year saw the adoption of several new SOPs:

- a) Rodent Carcass Disposal
- b) Rodent Toe-Clipping
- c) Extended isolation of the naked mole rats

d) Standard on Recordkeeping – Facility inspection reports have, for quite some time, revealed that some essential documentation and records have not been present or not available at the time of semi-annual facility inspections. An SOP was developed to standardize the required items necessary to be present at all times in the animal experimentation labs. Some of these records include: current approved protocol with IACUC approval letter; surgical records, drug records, and post-surgery analgesia records (if applicable); and, contact information for PI and Research Staff associated with the laboratory. The IACUC approval letters include the names of the individuals who are approved to work on each protocol. During a facility inspection, persons at work in a given laboratory can be verified by the approval letter.
