Dear Dr. O'Byrne,

The Office of Laboratory Animal Welfare (OLAW) acknowledges receipt of your April 3, 2018 letter reporting an instance of noncompliance with the PHS Policy on Humane Care and Use of Laboratory Animals at Wake Forest University. According to the information provided, OLAW understands that a hemostat had been left on the umbilical vessels following a C-section of a ewe and was retained following closure. The ewe's condition deteriorated and she required euthanasia. Upon necropsy the hemostat was discovered as well as ruptured uterine horns which had led to toxemia.

The preventive actions consisted of notifying and counseling the Principal Investigator and surgeon, and adding instrument counts to the surgical record sheet.

Based on its assessment of this explanation, OLAW understands that measures have been implemented to prevent recurrence of this problem. OLAW concurs with the actions taken by the institution to comply with the PHS Policy.

The Wake Forest University Animal Care & Use Program experienced a deviation from standard procedure that was determined by the Wake Forest University (WFU) Institutional Animal Care and Use Committee (IACUC) to be reportable to the NIH Office of Laboratory Animal Welfare.

PHS funding:

1R01HL135853-01A1. If appropriate, we will forward to our sponsored research office and all direct costs associated with the procurement, care and use of the animal(s) involved in this noncompliance event will be removed from this account and invoiced to and paid from a nonfederal source.

Incident

Five days following a c-section to deliver twin lambs, the ewe's condition deteriorated and, despite supportive treatment, was humanely euthanized due to poor prognosis. The necropsy revealed rupture of both uterine homs and the placenta protrusion into the abdominal cavity which likely resulted in sepsis/toxemia and the decline in health. The surgical incision site was found to be pristine, with sutures intact. As an incidental finding, a hemostat was found clamped to the umbilical vessels of the left placenta, which is the reason for this report.

Preliminary Report

No Preliminary Report was sent to OLAW.

Resolution

The WFU IACUC contacted the Principal Investigator and discussed current Institutional policies and regulatory compliance related to this concern. The IACUC approved the following actions to resolve this incident:

- 1. A Notification of Correction Action Letter was sent to the PI and to the surgeon who performed the c-section.
- 2. An instrument count has been added to the surgical record sheet.

All actions have been completed/implemented at this time and the WFU IACUC considers this non-compliance matter closed. The program oversight staff will continue to monitor animal care and use procedures to assure compliance with IACUC approved processes.
