Dear Dr. O'Byrne,

The Office of Laboratory Animal Welfare (OLAW) acknowledges receipt of your February 19, 2019 letter reporting an instance of noncompliance with the PHS Policy on Humane Care and Use of Laboratory Animals at Wake Forest University. According to the information provided, OLAW understands that twelve mice died after being given an experimental compound that included an incorrect ingredient which was not described in the approved protocol. A laboratory member had incorrectly constituted the mixture using a wrong component.

The corrective actions consisted of the Institutional Animal Care and Use Committee (IACUC) counseling the Principal Investigator (PI) on relevant policies and compliance and sending a Notification of Correction. The PI responded that the individual who prepared the compound will no longer prepare animal drugs and that laboratory staff must demonstrate proficiency in preparing experimental compounds for use in animals. Program oversight staff will monitor the laboratory to ensure compliance.

Based on its assessment of this explanation, OLAW understands that measures have been implemented to correct and prevent recurrence of this problem. OLAW concurs with the actions taken by the IACUC to comply with the PHS Policy.

The Wake Forest University Animal Care & Use Program experienced a deviation from standard procedure that was determined by the Wake Forest University (WFU) Institutional Animal Care and Use Committee (IACUC) to be reportable to the NIH Office of Laboratory Animal Welfare.

PHS Funding: 5R21 AR072806-02

If appropriate, we will forward to our sponsored research office and all direct costs associated with the procurement, care and use of the animal(s) involved in this non-compliance event will be removed from this account and invoiced to and paid from a nonfederal source.

Incident:

Twelve mice died after being injected with an experimental drug. It was determined that the drug compound administered was incorrectly made by a member of the lab staff. Dimethyl Sulfoxide (DMSO) was used as a vehicle instead of saline which resulted in the deaths of the animals.

Preliminary Report:

No preliminary report was made to OLAW.

Resolution:

The WFU IACUC contacted the Principal Investigator and discussed current institutional policies and regulatory compliance related to this concern. The IACUC approved the following actions to resolve this incident:

1. A Notification of Correction Letter was sent to the PJ. Per the PI, the lab staff member will no longer be making drugs to be used in animals. All lab members must demonstrate to the PI that they know how to correctly make Injectable drugs.

All actions have been completed/implemented at this time and the WFU IACUC considers this noncompliance matter closed. The program oversight staff will continue to monitor animal care and use procedures to assure compliance with IACUC approved processes. Wake Forest University is committed to protecting the welfare of animals used in research.
