Dear Dr. Orf.

The Office of Laboratory Animal Welfare (OLAW) acknowledges receipt of your May 12, 2020 letter reporting an instance of noncompliance with the PHS Policy on Humane Care and Use of Laboratory Animals at the Massachusetts General Hospital. According to the information provided, OLAW understands that following cardiac arrest and CPR, a protocol calls for mice to be monitored continuously until fully recovered from anesthesia, then every 4-6 hours until able to access food and water. In two experiments involving a total of two mice (November 28 and December 9), the animals were found moribund by the facility staff and were euthanized at the direction of the facility veterinarian. The PI immediately put the protocol on hold. The IACUC compliance officer met with the PI, the fellow, and the facility veterinarian on February 13 to review the event. A record review determined that the animals were provided post-operative analgesia in accordance with the approved protocol but the intensive monitoring plan did not continue beyond the day of the surgery as required. The investigation also determined the post-procedural care and monitoring was not documented fully cage-side, as required by MGH policy. It was stated that the animal activity was not supported by PHS/NSF or NASA funds.

Corrective and preventive actions included the following: retraining of all members of the research team by the facility veterinarian on appropriate monitoring for this model and the criteria that must be met before intensive monitoring can be discontinued; inclusion of all members of the team in post-procedural care, with a schedule posted prior to experiments starting, to ensure sufficient coverage for appropriate monitoring of the animals in accordance with the approved protocol; all members of the research team will be retrained in the proper use of rodent record cards and other CCM cards; documentation from the next 3 experiments will be provided to the IACUC compliance officer for review.


OLAW believes that the corrective measures put in place by the Massachusetts General Hospital are consistent with the provisions of the PHS Policy on Humane Care and Use of Laboratory Animals regarding the philosophy of institutional self-assessment, self-reporting and self-regulation. Although this activity was not PHS funded, the application of the expectations of the PHS Policy across the animal care and use program reduces any potential appearance of a double standard. We appreciate being informed of this matter and find no cause for further action by this office at this time.

Dear Dr. Morse:

This letter is to provide you with a full explanation of the circumstances and actions taken by the Massachusetts General Hospital (MGH) Institutional Animal Care and Use Committee (IACUC) as required by Public Health Service Policy on Humane Care and Use of Laboratory Animals (PHS Policy) Section IV.F.3 following an incident that occurred. The incident was determined by the IACUC to constitute serious noncompliance with PHS Policy and is therefore reportable.

The incident involved a protocol investigating the protective role of inhaled nitric oxide or infused sedative or analgesic agents on post-cardiac arrest/CPR outcomes. Following cardiac arrest and CPR, the protocol calls for mice to be monitored continuously until fully recovered from anesthesia, then every 4-6 hours until able to access food and water. In two experiments involving a total of two mice (November 28 and December 9), the animals were found moribund by the facility staff and were euthanized at the direction of the facility veterinarian. The PI immediately put the protocol on hold. The IACUC compliance officer met with the PI, the fellow, and the facility veterinarian on February 13 to review the event. A record review determined that the animals were provided post-operative analgesia in accordance with the approved protocol but the intensive monitoring plan did not continue beyond the day of the surgery and should have. The investigation also determined the post-procedural care and monitoring was not documented fully cage-side, as required by MGH policy.

A compliance subcommittee of the IACUC reviewed the event on March 5 and the convened IACUC reviewed the event at its monthly meeting on March 18. The PI took full responsibility for the incident and worked with the IACUC compliance officer to develop a corrective action plan to prevent a recurrence of this event.

The IACUC approved the following corrective actions:

Retraining of all members of the research team by the facility veterinarian on appropriate monitoring for this model and the criteria that must be met before intensive monitoring can be discontinued. Inclusion of all members of the team in post-procedural care, with a schedule

posted prior to experiments starting, to ensure sufficient coverage for appropriate monitoring of the animals in accordance with the approved protocol.

- All members of the research team will be retrained in the proper use of rodent record cards and other CCM cards. The rodent record card is used as a tool to ensure, and document, compliance with the treatment and monitoring plan of the approved protocol.
- When research operations resume post-COVID-19, documentation from the next 3 experiments will be provided to the IACUC compliance officer for review.

No PHS/NSF/NASA funds were implicated in this matter.
