# INSTITUTIONAL ANIMAL CARE AND USE COMMITTEE MEETING MINUTES August 19, 2020

The Institutional Animal Care and Use Committee virtually met on August 19, 2020. The [IACUC Chair] called the meeting to order at 1:01 pm. Seventeen members were present, fulfilling the quorum requirement of ten of 18 voting members in attendance.

# **ANNOUNCEMENTS:**

OAV staff briefly went through the etiquette on video conferencing. Alternate members who were voting at the meeting were announced.

[7] and [F] were named IACUC members of the month. This was their last IACUC meeting. Both were thanked for their service on the committee and [F] was also thanked for his service on the Investigative Subcommittee (IS).

Open Session: 1:03 pm

### **NEW BUSINESS:**

OAV staff presented changes to Document 101. The policy had been circulated to members prior to the meeting. Changes focused on formatting and text deletions. New information added covered an introductory paragraph indicating the purpose of the policy. Text had been justified and spacing corrected to match the new format. Deletions included extra background information not needed as part of the policy. This information was moved to a reference section at the end of the document. Definitions other than "Animal" were moved to another document titled "Additional Definitions". The secondary document contained references and resources that did not need to be a part of the policy and did not require a vote. A link to the additional definitions was added at the end of the policy.

### Discussion:

Discussion centered around avians and considering them animals at 85% of their required incubation. [Q] questioned whether the policy definition for animal should be different than the regulatory agencies definitions. [AV] informed the committee on OLAW's position; avians were considered animals upon hatching. It was explained that the policy was written this way due to a previous issue. [IACUC Chair] stated since the policy had been reduced significantly this definition should remain at this time. The Administrative Burden Reduction Committee could be tasked to revisit the document. Several members questioned whether people who use eggs even know about this policy and would this really prevent accidental hatchings. Others

noted that this could be regarded as regulatory creep. [E] indicated this would be a good reference for PIs and help IACUC members to determine when an IACUC protocol was needed in these cases. More discussion ensued. [6] indicated if a hatching occurred, if no protocol was in place, that was a serious noncompliance. The policy as written provided a buffer for that situation. It was determined a consensus of the committee could not be reached at this time. [13] announced his subcommittee would review this policy.

[AV] made a motion to accept Document 101 as presented. [6] seconded the motion. The motion passed as follows For: 13; Against: 4.

OAV staff presented changes to Document 102. The policy had been circulated to members prior to the meeting. Changes were mainly formatting and text deletions. The text had been justified and spacing corrected to match the new format. Added verbiage included the introductory paragraph similar to Document 101. The only additions to this policy were sentences giving examples for non-survival surgery and a definition for "multiple survival surgery". The Guidelines and references included via link at the end of the policy were not changed and did not require a vote.

No members had questions or concerns.

[7] made a motion to accept Document 102 as presented. [15] seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

OAV staff presented the following sections of the Semiannual Program Review: *IACUC, IACUC Protocol Review, IACUC Membership & Functions, IACUC Training, IACUC Records & Reporting Requirements.* Results are included at the end of the minutes. There was a question if a note should be added to the Program Review to indicate a waiver from OLAW for site inspections had been granted. It was determined this was not necessary.

[18] gave a brief AAALAC update. The completed program description had been submitted and accepted. Coordinating the site visit schedule with the VA in the fall was in progress.

[IACUC Chair] indicated for the remaining portion of the meeting that protocol discussions would be considered in closed session and would be reflected as such in the minutes. Voting immediately followed each protocol discussion and is reflected in the minutes as open session. Noncompliance discussions were considered to be held in closed session and are reflected in the minutes as such. Voting occurred immediately after each discussion. Voting to suspend a protocol would be held in open session, but all other sanctions and/or recommendations to the IO would be considered to be held in closed session and be reflected as such in the minutes. Business portions of the agenda were held in open session.

There were no updates for the Subcommittee for Training, for Food Restriction/Fasting Requiring Full Committee Review, or the Administrative Burden Reduction Committee.

# **ANNOUNCEMENTS:**

OAV staff briefly went through etiquette on video conferencing.

OAV staff announced the number of voting members present including alternate members who were voting.

[Q] introduced the new members of the IACUC [C], [F], [I], [8] and indicated [7] is now a full voting member.

[7] was named IACUC member of the month.

[IACUC Chair] reminded members to let the IACUC office know if they were experiencing any delays with reviews with the start of the new semester and if necessary, protocols can be reassigned.

# **NEW BUSINESS:**

**Document 104:** [Q] noted the changes made to the document including formatting changes, deletion of extraneous information, reorganization of the list of "musts" for researchers, removing numbers from the reference section, the addition of a PI responsibility statement to ensure staff are trained prior to anesthetic equipment use and the inclusion of verbiage from EH&S to ensure proper use of open drop techniques.

The discussion for this document involved removing redundant information requiring the certification technician to initial the anesthesia machine and replacing the word "validated" with certified. [OAV staff] reminded the committee that only persons who were notified at the beginning of the meeting needed to vote and assisted with the voting mechanisms.

IACUC Meeting MinutesSeptember 16, 2020Page | 2[15] made a motion to accept the revisions to Document 104. [AV] seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

**Document 106:** [Q] noted the changes made to the document including formatting changes, changes to the order of requirements, AALAS Learning Library information was streamlined, "exemption" was changed to "exception" for research consultants, added a paragraph for DLAR and Farm husbandry staff indicating training for husbandry personnel as the responsibility of the respective unit, and replaced the Occupational Health course requirement. An orientation for new IACUC members was also added to the document as a requirement.

The committee had no questions or comments for this document.

[K] made a motion to accept the revisions to Document 106. [10] seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.


[D] an alternate member joined the meeting not effecting quorum.

**Semiannual Report:** [Q] presented the following section of the Semiannual Program Review: *Animal Care and Use Program and Veterinary Care*. There was a brief discussion about the use of private veterinarians, however the programmatic responsibility falls to the Attending Veterinarian for animal care oversight.

**Document 123:** [7] introduced this topic with background information on a recently reviewed protocol. Due to COVID the experiment was halted at Woodford farm and to avoid outside contact with persons and animals the PI wanted to use personal animals. [7] expressed concern of a potential COI with policy section 123.4 where oversight of animal care is delegated to the PI. Could confirmation of animal care be achieved if owner/manager are the same? It was clarified that there would be minimal involvement with animals as a drone was being used. Questions raised were could confirmation of animal care be achieved if owner/manage were the same, boiling down to could a PI use their own animals? The committee decided there was no clear-cut policy solution, and these should be handled on a case by case basis with reasonable oversight from the IACUC. [IACUC Chair] stated these instances were very rare and don't warrant a policy change, clarifying that document 123 is specific to farm animals. [7] indicated this was brought to the committee as information only and the PI adequately addressed COI concerns. No vote was required.

[IACUC Chair] indicated for the remaining portion of the meeting that protocol discussions would be considered in closed session and would be reflected as such in the minutes. Voting immediately followed each protocol discussion and is reflected in the minutes as open session. Noncompliance discussions were considered to be held in closed session and are reflected in the minutes as such. Voting occurred immediately after each discussion. Voting to suspend a protocol would be held in open session, but all other sanctions and/or recommendations to the IO would be considered to be held in closed session and be reflected as such in the minutes. 



To replace an obsolete training offered to those performing large animal surgery, [C], [AV], [Q], [7] and OAV staff have been working internally and with AALAS to develop a course. The initial draft of the course has been reviewed and development continues with the hope that it will be available online by early/mid-2021.

In accordance with the PHS Assurance and requirements set forth in 9 Code of Federal Regulations (CFR) and institutional policy, the following Designated Review Protocols, Annual Reviews and Amendments have been reviewed and approved by a designated member of the IACUC. The Full Committee was informed of the Designated Review Protocols, Annual Reviews and Amendments as noted on the December 9, 2020 agenda.
