The Office of Laboratory Animal Welfare (OLAW) acknowledges receipt of your February 26, 2018 letter reporting a serious deviation from the provisions of the *Guide for the Care and Use of Laboratory Animals* at the University of Texas at El Paso, following up on an initial report on January 15, 2018. According to the information provided, OLAW understands that two mice were identified as being thin and weak due to lack of food. The problem had not been noted during the daily health check by the animal care staff or research staff.

The immediate action taken upon discovery consisted of notifying the Attending Veterinarian who provided food to the mice which subsequently recovered. The animal care staff was retrained on conducting health checks and the laboratory staff was directed to conduct weekly cage checks, and to maintain a log with the date and time the cages were checked.

Based on its assessment of this explanation, OLAW understands that measures have been implemented to correct and prevent recurrence of this problem. OLAW concurs with the actions taken by the institution to comply with the PHS Policy on Humane Care and Use of Laboratory Animals.

The University of Texas at El Paso (UTEP), in accordance with PHS Policy IV.F.3., provides this report concerning animal welfare issues on protocol A-201201-1: Preclinical therapeutic studies of metastatic human cancer cell lines. The IACUC office communicated the incident to OLAW with a preliminary report and requested a case be opened on January 15, 2018 on behalf of the IO.

On Friday, January 12, 2018, Laboratory Animal Resource Center (LARC) staff discovered one cage containing two mice that appeared thin and weak. Upon further inspection, it was noted that the cage did not have a food hopper (located at the back of the cage). It is unknown how long the mice had been without food. The Attending Veterinarian (AV) was immediately notified and the animals were assessed. They were provided food and placed on a watch list and have since recovered. The IACUC was later notified and in turn informed the IACUC Chair, members and IO. The IACUC Chair appointed a subcommittee to investigate the incident.

The sub-committee interviewed several LARC staff as well as the PI and the PI's senior lab member. Several items were confirmed:

- Cage change-outs occurred that Monday
- LARC staff performed daily checks, however it was missed
- The PI's lab members also confirmed being in the room that week and missed it
- The PI's lab does not keep a log for animal checks
- It was undetermined how many days the animals were without food

The sub-committee's findings were inconclusive as either LARC staff or the PI's lab may have overlooked replacing the food hopper back on the cage. As a result, the AV held reinforcement training a meeting with LARC staff to reiterate extra attention to cages with food hoppers located in the back of the cage. The sub-committee also requested that the PI lab conduct weekly checks, keep a log, and document the date and time that animals were checked. This was undoubtedly human error and the measures mentioned above may assist in avoiding this type of situation in the future. The measures were approved by a fully convened IACUC meeting held February 23, 2018.

On behalf of the Institutional Official, this email is to inform you of an incident involving two mice found without food. The mice are alive but weak and recovering.

Briefly, a mouse cage containing two mice was found without a wire top or food but the water bottle was in place. The mice were offered food, ate readily and were observed for ~15 minutes. The cage was tagged for continued monitoring and an investigation is underway.

We request a case be open for the incident and a more detailed report will be sent with the corrective actions at a later time.
