<u>Cage size Allowance/Multiple Litters per Cage:</u> The IC ACUC has approved a "Fourteen Heads – Fourteen Days" policy as an engineering standard. On day fourteen postpartum the maximum number of animals permitted per cage is fourteen. This includes the three adults (one male, two females) and up to eleven pups whose birth dates are not more than 7 days apart. Separation of the litter on day fifteen, rather than at an earlier date is facilitated by the fact that by fourteen days postpartum most pups are supplementing their milk diet with solid food. Therefore, if one of the dams is a poor milk producer, the negative impact of separating the litter and placing some of the pups solely with the poorly lactating female is minimized. (reference: *Guide*, p. 56-57)

- Changes diluents than those currently approved in the ASP but which are not expected to change the objectives of the study, increase pain or distress, impact the approved endpoint criteria, or impact the approved personnel safety considerations. Specifically, these include PBS, normal saline, water, corn oil, sesame oil, DMSO, and ethanol.
- Use of Trio or Harem breeding when the procedures are consistent with NICHD SOP 2.220 (Breeding and Weaning Rodents)
 - Change in duration, frequency, type or number of procedures performed on an animal that are not expected to increase pain or distress, impact the approved endpoint criteria, or impact the approved personnel safety considerations. The following procedures are allowed:
 - Blood sampling method, volume, & frequency consistent with ARAC guidelines <u>http://oacu.od.nih.gov/ARAC/documents/Rodent_Bleeding.pdf</u>
 - Food/water control consistent with ARAC guidelines <u>http://oacu.od.nih.gov/ARAC/documents/Diet_Control.pdf</u>
 - Genotyping method consistent with NICHD 6B Facility SOP 3.113
 - Behavior test methods and duration consistent with NICHD SOP "Behavioral tests in rodents.

Procedure:

- PIs will submit amendments through the ACUC coordinator. If the PI requests that the amendment be reviewed and acted on prior to the next scheduled ACUC meeting, the coordinator can forward the amendments to the APD or one of the facility veterinarians. If approved, the amendment will be returned to the ACUC coordinator for processing.
- The relevant facility and the PI will be notified by email and receive a signed copy of the amendment. The approved amendment will also be listed on the agenda for the next ACUC meeting and posted on the ACUC members web page for review and possible discussion at the ACUC meeting
