Cage Size Allowance/Multiple Litters per Cage: The NIMH ACUC has approved "Fourteen Heads — Fourteen Days" policy. As an engineering standard, on day fourteen postpartum the maximum number of mice permitted in the cage is fourteen. This includes the three adults (one male, two females) and up to eleven pups whose birthdays are not more than 7 days apart. Separation of the litter on day fifteen, rather than at an earlier date is facilitated by the fact that by fourteen days postpartum most pups are supplementing their milk diet with solid food. Therefore, if one of the dams is a poor milk producer, the negative impact of separating the litter and placing some of the pups solely with the poorly lactating female is minimized.

Multiple Species Housing: There are currently two animal rooms housing multiple rodent species in the same room, in Redacted by agreement Rats and mice are used as sentinels for Nile Grass Rats and for hamsters. Rats mice, and hamsters do not have direct or visual contact. Exhaust air from the rack passes through HEPA filters. Rodents are monitored for normal behavior and have not had issues of poor breeding/neonatal care indicative of stress. Investigators are aware of the housing situation and have evaluated the practice for its potential impact on their research. The veterinary staff has reviewed literature cited by the Guide and AAALAC to ensure appropriate management practices for these situations.
