Dear Ms. Deuser,

The Office of Laboratory Animal Welfare (OLAW) acknowledges receipt of your September 9, 2020 letter reporting an instance of noncompliance with the PHS Policy on Humane Care and Use of Laboratory Animals at Arizona State University, following up on an initial report on August 18, 2020. According to the information provided, OLAW understands that a rat had been inadvertently left in a behavioral testing chamber overnight by a student undergoing training.

The immediate action taken upon discovery consisted of placing the rat in its home cage and providing food and water. The corrective actions consisted of having laboratory staff check all cages when in the housing rooms; resetting the training timeline for the student responsible; modifying a checklist to now include checking all chambers and counting cages in the vivarium along with the person's initials, and having laboratory staff take responsibility for all animals not just those on their project. The Principal Investigator was counseled to follow the corrective action plan and to update the Institutional Animal Care and Use Committee (IACUC) as to the plan's status.

Based on its assessment of this explanation, OLAW understands that measures have been implemented to correct and prevent recurrence of this problem. OLAW concurs with the actions taken by the IACUC to comply with the PHS Policy.

On July 31, 2020 the lab manager was conducting the final session of training with a student. They had performed a rat self-administration study in which the rats are moved from the vivarium to the lab study rooms where the behavior chambers are housed. Following completion of the study, the lab manager asked the student to transfer the rats to their home cages for transport to the vivarium while he (the lab manager) tended to an experiment within the research lab proper. When the lab manager returned to the study room, the rat cages were already covered on the cart in preparation for their return to the vivarium. The lab manager asked the student to go ahead and return the rats to the vivarium.

The following day, the lab manager discovered that one rat had been left in the study chamber rather than having been transported back to the vivarium. He immediately provided food and water to the rat in its home cage in the vivarium and contacted the Principal Investigator (PI). Together, they then contacted the IACUC Chair and IACUC Compliance office.

Corrective Action

The lab implemented the following steps to help ensure that this does not happen again:

- All lab personnel check all cages (not only those for their own project) when in the housing rooms;
- The training clock was reset for the student (this is written in the lab's training plan);
- A checklist in current use was modified to include active checking of all chambers in the study room and cage count in the vivarium, to be initialed for every procedure that includes moving the rats from the vivarium;

Lab leaders established an emphasis on each person taking responsibility for all animals, regardless
of project participation.

A preliminary report was filed with OLAW on August 18, 2020. The IACUC reviewed the Pl's Action Plan at the fully convened meeting on August 27, 2020. The committee agreed with the steps taken by the lab and did not add any further requirements. However, at the suggestion of the committee, the Chair and IACUC Compliance Coordinator joined the Pl in a Zoom call on September 1, 2020, to discuss the importance of making sure the chosen Action Plan is working and is accomplishing the goals set by the lab. The Pl agreed with the importance of monitoring and will periodically update the committee of success or changes as needed.

The committee feels that the PI has made an appropriate commitment to monitoring practices put into place to ensure that this incident is not repeated in the future.
