The Office of Laboratory Animal Welfare (OLAW) acknowledges receipt of your September 21, 2020 letter reporting a noncompliance with the PHS Policy on the Humane Care and Use of Laboratory Animals at the University of Minnesota (IACUC #37591A). According to the information provided it is understood that although a pig received SR buprenorphine and Carprofen pre- and post-operatively on January 24, 2020, according to the protocol, the animal did not receive lidocaine/bupivacaine at the laparotomy site prior to closure as part of the implant surgery. This deviation in protocol occurred in one animal. The activity involved was supported by PHS funds.

Corrective and preventive actions included the PI confirming that if more work is performed on this study, Iidocaine/bupivacaine will be given at the site of surgery prior to closure as is outlined in the approved protocol.

OLAW believes that the corrective and preventive measures put in place by the University of Minnesota are consistent with the provisions of the PHS Policy on Humane Care and Use of Laboratory Animals for institutional self-monitoring and self-reporting. We appreciate being informed of this matter and find no cause for further action by this office.
