This represents the Semiannual Report of the Institutional Animal Care and Use Committee (IACUC) to the Institutional Official, as required by the PHS Policy on Humane Care and Use of Laboratory Animals, as a condition of this institution's Animal Welfare Assurance with the Office of Laboratory Animal Welfare (OLAW), and the Animal Welfare Act and Animal Welfare Regulations, as applicable.

Review of Animal Care and Use Program

The IACUC conducted its semiannual review of the institution's animal care and use program on November 30, 2018, using the Guide for the Care and Use of Laboratory Animals, 8th Edition (Guide, 8th Edition), and, as applicable, 9 CFR Chapter I, 2.31. No deficiencies were identified and all aspects of the program are consistent with the PHS Policy, the Guide, and applicable Animal Welfare Regulations.

The annual registration application for the NYS Department of Health was submitted on November 1, 2018 and the completed annual report to the USDA was submitted on November 28, 2018.

(b) (6) joined the meeting to discuss the potential for creating a course that could use the animal vivarium to teach the elements of animal welfare and husbandry practices.

Accreditation

The Institution's Program for Laboratory Animal Care and Use is currently not accredited by the Association for the Assessment and Accreditation of Laboratory Animal Care International (AAALAC).

Inspection of Animal Facilities

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The IACUC inspected the animal facilities on November 30, 2018, using the *Guide*, 8th Edition, and, as applicable, 9 CFR Chapter I, 2.31. No deficiencies were identified in the animal facility and the facility is consistent with the PHS Policy, the *Guide*, and applicable Animal Welfare Regulations. The facility conditions, enrichment available to the animals and record keeping continues to be exemplary.

There are currently no IACUC approved departures from the Guide.
